

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

RAILWAY, DELORAINE TO MERSEY:

PETITIONS.

Laid upon the Table by the Minister of Lands, and ordered by the House to be printed, September 12, 1878.



To His Excellency Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esq., C.M.G., Governor, Commanderin-Chief, and Vice-Admiral of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

THE Petition of the undersigned Inhabitants of Launceston and Deloraine.

HUMBLY SHOWETH-

That Petitioners are convinced and fully persuaded that the construction and working of the Railways of this Colony, though imperfect and partial as they are, materially assist the development of the resources of those portions of the Colony reasonably accessible to them.

That whilst Petitioners are rendered legally liable for their quota of costs incurred in their construction, &c., their inaccessibility deprives Petitioners of participation in the benefits derivable therefrom.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will, by and with the advice and consent of your Executive Council, adopt such measures as will ensure the speedy extension of Railway communication from Deloraine to the Mersey.

And Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
