



ELEVENTH Annual Report of the Inspector of the Constabulary Forces maintained by Municipalities in Tasmania for the Year ending the 30th June, 1868.—(Pursuant to 29th Victoria, No. 9.)

Office of Inspector of Police, 28th July, 1868.

Sir

In submitting for the information of His Excellency the Governor my Eleventh Annual Report on the Constabulary Forces of the Municipalities in Tasmania, I have the honor to inform you that, with a few exceptions, they continue to be maintained in a very satisfactory state of efficiency. Some few, however, are barely strong enough to pass the test; and in one Municipality (Brighton) the Force is not sufficient to secure the Public due protection in the town itself. Serious crime, particularly such as is generally accompanied by violence, has decreased during the past year; and although, on the average, there does not appear to have been any considerable diminution in minor offences, they have been of such a character as must be expected to occur so long as there remains in our community any large number of old convicts, to whom honest labour is more objectionable than detention and working in a prison.

On the commencement of the Launceston and Deloraine Railway works the responsibility of strengthening their Constabularies will fall on the Municipalities through which the railway passes: this they will, I have no doubt, be prepared to do as the necessity arises.

No further municipal action has been taken throughout the Colony,—obvious difficulties presenting themselves to its extension to the remaining Police Districts.

I annex the usual tabular return explanatory of the numerical strength, &c. of the several Forces.

MUNICIPALITIES.

CITY OF HOBART.—(Established February 1st, 1858.)

This Force remains unchanged in organisation, numerical strength, or pay; and maintains a satisfactory standard of efficiency. At inspection there were no vacancies, but one Petty Constable was absent sick. The men looked clean and healthy, and the uniform, accountrements, and necessaries were in very good order. There had been no case of misconduct deserving of punishment recorded since my last inspection against any remaining member of the Force. One Sub-Inspector had retired from ill-health, receiving a gratuity. One Petty Constable had resigned, and another had been dismissed for unfitness. Permanency of service continues to be a favourable feature in the Force.

During the year ending the 30th June 309 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 202 persons were apprehended, of whom 153 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. Informations had been laid against 16 public-houses, and penalties inflicted in 10 cases. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 237, of whom 148 were males and 92 females. The station-house, wards, and cells were in good repair and clean, and the books, records, and returns distinctly and correctly kept.

The Acting Sub-Inspector inspects the common lodging-houses, and is the Summoning Officer of the Police Court; and a Medical man is attached to the Force.

The numerical strength of this Force, its organisation, and its pay remain unaltered, and its efficiency and permanency of service maintain a satisfactory standard. An Acting Sub-Inspector had resigned on receiving the appointment of Superintendent of a Rural Municipality, and one Petty Constable had been dismissed for drunkenness; but with this exception none of the men had misconducted themselves. The men looked well, and their uniform, arms, accountrements, and necessaries were in excellent order.

During the year ending the 30th June 183 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 112 persons had been apprehended, of whom 70 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. Two publicans only had been proceeded against, and penalties inflicted in both cases. 258 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, 150 of whom were males and 108 females. The books, records, and returns were correctly and intelligibly kept, and the station-house and cells were in good repair and clean. The new Police Office, Superintendent's Offices and quarters are now occupied, and afford every necessary accommodation. The Superintendent is Examiner of Weights and Measures, and the Sub-Inspector the Inspector of Nuisances. A Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

RURAL MUNICIPALITIES.

The organisation and authorised strength of this Force remains unaltered, but there were two vacancies for two Special Constables at important points of communication at the time of Inspection. Its efficiency was thus temporarily somewhat impaired. The Uniform worn by the men was of good quality, and their arms and accountrements were in very serviceable order. One Petty Constable had been committed for trial on a charge of Larceny, and dismissed.

During the year ending the 30th June 3 informations had been laid against publicans, and penalties inflicted in 2 cases. 22 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 15 persons were apprehended, of whom 12 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 18 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 15 were males and 3 females. The head station-house required some trivial repairs which were about to be made. The out-stations, wards, and cells were in good repair and clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. A Medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

SPRING BAY .- (Established October 19th, 1860.)

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength, organisation, and pay, and is efficient. A Sub-Inspector has been dismissed since my last inspection. The Escort station suggested as necessary on the boundaries of the adjacent Municipalities of Richmond and Sorell has not been erected.

During the year ending the 30th June 7 indictable offences only had been reported to the Police, for which 2 persons were apprehended and committed for trial. 5 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, 4 males and 1 female. No informations had been laid against any publicans. The Force now wears an undress uniform of good quality of its kind. The station-houses, wards and cells were in good repair and clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. The arms and accountrements were in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock. No Medical man is attached to the Force.

CLARENCE.—(Established November 13th, 1860.)

This Force has been placed on a more satisfactory basis, and its standard of efficiency raised by the re-appointment of 2 Special Constables as I suggested at points which required protection. Its pay I still, however, consider too low. No resignations nor dismissals from the Force had taken place since last inspection.

During the year ending the 30th June 10 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 9 persons were apprehended, of whom 5 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 9 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 6 were males and 3 females. One information had been laid against a publican, and a penalty inflicted. The Force is not supplied with uniform, but their arms and account ements were in good order. The station-houses were in good repair, and the wards and cells clean. The books, records, and returns were correctly kept. No Medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Surveyor of Roads, Inspetor of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

RICHMOND.—(Established 1st August, 1861.)

The numerical strength of this Force remains unaltered, but a change in its organisation by the consolidation (consequent on the resignation of the Superintendent) of the offices of Superintendent and Council Clerk has been effected. Its pay has also, I consider, been reduced to too low a standard to secure that efficiency and permanency of service which has hitherto existed. In a Municipality of such a large area and population, with the amount of work devolving on this officer as Council Clerk, I much doubt the expediency of this consolidation, particularly as the Superintendent is allowed to reside several miles from Richmond; and I have addressed the Council, suggesting that to secure an efficient supervision and working of the Force, it is essential that he should reside at head quarters. There had been no resignations nor dismissals, with the exception of that of the Superintendent who retired voluntarily from the Force.

During the year ending the 30th June 35 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 25 persons had been apprehended, of whom 13 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 32 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 20 were males and 12 females. No proceedings had been taken against any publicans. The station-houses, wards, and cells were in good repair and clean, and the uniform, arms, and account ements in serviceable condition, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. A Sub-Inspector is an Inspector of Stock, and a Sergeant is the Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions. No Medical man is attached to the Force.

OATLANDS .- (Established 9th January, 1862.)

This Force remains unchanged in numerical strength, organisation, and pay, and maintains an efficient standard. A reduction of one Petty Constable at head quarters was contemplated. There had been no dismissals nor resignations from the Force since my last inspection, showing a very satisfactory permanence of service. The uniform was very good, and the arms and accountrements in very serviceable order.

During the year ending the 30th June 44 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 22 persons had been apprehended, of whom 20 were committed for trial or summarrily convicted. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 39, of whom 17 were males and 22 females. Five informations had been laid against publicans, in 4 of which penalties were inflicted. The Station-houses were in good repair; the wards and cells clean; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No Medical Officer is attached to the force. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

The numerical strength, pay, and organisation of this Force, which satisfactorily maintains its efficiency, remains unaltered. The men were well clothed, and their arms and accourrements were in very serviceable order. One Constable had been dismissed since my last inspection.

During the year ending the 30th June 61 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 32 persons had been apprehended, of whom 30 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 89 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 50 were males and 39 females. No proceedings had been taken against any publican. The Station-houses were in good repair; the wards and cells clean; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

GREEN PONDS.—(Established 15th April, 1862.)

The numerical strength of this Force has been increased by one Petty Constable, whose appointment to a Station where protection was required I suggested on my last inspection. Its organisation remains unaltered, but its pay, particularly that of the Superintendent, has been reduced to too low a standard. One Petty Constable had resigned, but there had been no dismissals from the Force.

During the year ending the 30th June 36 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 24 persons had been apprehended, of whom 20 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 62 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 49 were males and 13 females. No informations had been laid against publicans. The Station-houses were in good repair; and it is proposed shortly to build an additional one at Constitution Hill. The wards and cells were clean; the uniform good; the arms and account ements in serviceable order; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical man is attached to the force. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

SORELL.—(Established 30th June, 1862.)

The numerical strength, organisation, and pay of this Force remains unaltered. It is efficient, but will not bear further reduction. Discipline had improved, and more attention had been paid to the appearance of the men and their uniform, which of its kind was good. One Sergeant had resigned, but there had been no dismissals.

During the year ending the 30th June there had been 26 indictable offences reported to the Police, for which 13 persons were apprehended, of whom 8 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 41 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 21 were males and 20 females. No publicans had been proceeded against. The head station-house required repairs which were about to be effected. The wards and cells were clean; the books, returns, and records correctly kept; and the arms and accountrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to the force.

A reduction of one Petty Constable has been made since my last inspection in this Force, which is now at a minimum standard of efficiency. Arrangements having been made for the escorting of its own prisoners to and from the boundary of the Municipality, the contribution towards the Melton Mowbray Station in the Municipality of Green Ponds is now withdrawn. An extra horse is maintained at Head Quarters, by which the movements of the force are expedited. One Sergeant had been dismissed.

During the year ending the 30th June 16 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 8 persons had been apprehended, of whom 7 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 33 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 23 were males and 10 females. No informations had been laid against publicans. The Station-houses were in good repair; the wards and cells clean; the uniform worn by the men of good quality; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept, and the arms and accountrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to the force.

The numerical strength of this Force has been reduced, by the services of a Special Constable having been dispensed with. Its organisation and pay remain unchanged, though a consolidation of the appointments of Superintendent and Council Clerk was proposed, which will not in such a small Municipality, I think, materially affect its efficiency. One Petty Constable had been dismissed and one had resigned.

During the year ending the 30th June 19 indictable offences have been reported to the Police, for which 17 persons had been arrested, of whom 15 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 13 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 8 were males and 5 females. Informations had been laid against 6 publicans, and penalties inflicted in every case. The station-house and cells require shingling, but were otherwise in good repair. The wards and cells were clean; the books, records, and returns correctly kept; the uniform good, and the arms and account ements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

This Force is an efficient one; and its organisation, pay, and numerical strength remain unaltered. One Sub-Inspector and two Petty Constables had resigned. A new station was about to be erected at Fonthill, which will make the arrangements at all the out-stations very complete.

During the year ending 30th June 28 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 27 persons were arrested, of whom 12 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 50 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 36 were males and 14 females. No proceedings had been taken against publicans. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean. The uniform in excellent condition; the books, records, and returns correctly kept, and the arms and accoutrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Town Surveyor, Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

This Force is an efficient one, and has undergone no alteration in numerical strength, organisation, or pay since my last inspection. There had been no resignations nor dismissals.

During the year ending 30th June 44 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 38 persons had been arrested, of whom 33 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 31 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 15 were males and 16 females. No informations had been laid against publicans. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform in excellent order, and the arms and accoutrements very serviceable. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical man is attached to the Force.

The organisation, numerical strength, and pay of this Force remain unaltered. It is an efficient one. There had been no dismissals nor resignations. The cells at the Ouse station were not fit nor safe for the custody of felons, but this was about to be rectified.

During the year ending the 30th June 44 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 33 persons had been apprehended, of whom 33 were committed or summarily convicted. 35 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 28 were males and 7 females. No informations had been laid against publicans. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform good, and the arms and accoutrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical man is attached to the Force.

This Force is not maintained on a satisfactory standard of efficiency; another Petty Constable is required at head quarters, the watch-house keeper (with the exception of the Superintendent) being the only full paid Constable in the Town, which requires further protection, particularly at night. Its organisation and pay remain unaltered, the salary of the Superintendent being inadequate; a Sergeant was under suspension, but no dismissal had occurred.

During the year ending the 30th June 32 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 27 persons had been arrested, of whom 21 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 84 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 58 were males and 26 females. Proceedings had been taken against one publican, and a penalty inflicted. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the uniform in good order, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, and the arms and accountrements serviceable. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

No change has occurred in the numerical strength, organisation, or pay of this Force, which very satisfactorily maintains its efficiency. It is well paid, and permanence of service is a favourable feature in it. Every Constable at an out-station is mounted, and its efficiency thereby increased. There had been no dismissals nor resignations.

During the year ending the 30th June 66 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 49 persons had been arrested, of whom 31 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 128 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 115 were males and 13 females. No proceedings had been taken against Publicans. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform good, and the arms and accountrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. A medical man is attached to the Force.

This Force remains unaltered in organization, numerical strength, and pay, and maintains its efficiency. One Petty Constable has been dismissed, but subsequently re-appointed.

During the year ending the 30th June 51 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 50 persons had been apprehended, of whom 36 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 129 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 99 were males and 30 females. One information had been laid against a publican, and a penalty inflicted. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform good, and the arms and accountrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. A Medical Officer is paid specially for attendance on the Force.

This Force maintains its efficiency, and remains unaltered in numerical strength and pay. Its organisation has, however, been somewhat changed by the consolidation of the appointments of Superintendent and Council Clerk, but its efficiency is not materially affected, the area of the Municipality being small. No dismissals nor resignations had occurred. A Water Bailiff has been appointed under the Salmon Protection Act, and placed under the control of the Superintendent, but he is not included in the effective strength.

During the year ending the 30th June 18 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 12 persons were arrested, of whom 11 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 9 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 7 were males and 2 females.

Proceedings had been taken against one publican, and a penalty inflicted. The station-house, which has not yet been enlarged, was in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform good, and the arms and accoutrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Inspector of Stock and Examiner of Weights and Measures. A Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

No change has taken place in the organisation, numerical strength, or pay of this Force since my last inspection. It is an efficient one. Two Petty Constables had resigned. The new Council Chambers, including a Superintendent's office, were finished and occupied.

During the year ending the 30th June 22 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 20 persons had been apprehended, of whom 18 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 39 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 38 were males and 1 a female. Proceedings had been taken against 2 publicans, and penalties inflicted in both cases. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform good, and the arms and accourtements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. A Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

The numerical strength of this Force has been increased by the addition of a Petty Constable since my last report. It satisfactorily maintains its efficiency. One Sergeant and two Petty Constables had resigned, and a Petty Constable had died. The head station-house requires increased accommodation which it is proposed to provide.

During the year ending the 30th June 55 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 36 persons had been arrested, of whom 22 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 92 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 67 were males and 35 females. Proceedings had been taken against two publicans, and in one case a penalty inflicted. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, the books, records, and returns correctly kept, the uniform good, and the arms and accoutrements in serviceable order. The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force.
