

To the Honorable the Legislative Council of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Inhabitants of Glamorgan.

RESPE CTFULLY SHOWETH:

THAT your Petitioners believe the continuance of State Aid to Religion to be conducive to the highest interests of society.

In many thinly populated Districts its withdrawal would, undoubtedly, lead to the cessation or interruption of Public Worship, and the declension in moral feeling, which is but too apparent where the ministrations of Religion are of rare occurrence.

Your Petitioners therefore pray, that the sum reserved in the Constitutional Act for Ecclesiastical purposes may be continued.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
