

Cascade Establishment, February, 1873.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to submit my annual Returns for the past year, showing the cost, &c.

You will observe that the cost per head for Paupers, Gaol and House of Correction for Females, and Reformatory for Male Juvenile Offenders is less than last year, although the price of provisions has been higher than that of 1871. The proceeds from labour, &c. have been more, which you will perceive by reference to the Returns marked A., F., and J.

The amount for the maintenance of Children is higher than that of last year: this is owing to the difference in the price of provisions, &c.

As to the general working of the Establishment, I have nothing to add further. The conduct of the different classes, as a rule, has been good.

The system of apprenticing out the boys from the Training School has been adopted; three have been bound, and are going on very satisfactorily.

I would beg leave to call your attention to my last year's Report, in which I pointed out the necessity there existed for a law for the proper management of Paupers and Juvenile Offenders. Unless the Legislature pass an Act for the control and working of these Institutions it is impossible they can ever work well.
