

## ANNUAL REPORT, 1882

In presenting the Annual Report of the Hobart Industrial School for Girls, your Committee have much pleasure in testifying to the steady manner in which the work of the School is carried on, and have to congratulate the Institution on the continued untiring interest shown for the inmates by the Matron, and also the efficiency of its teachers. The President's chair becoming vacant, owing to Mrs. Bromby having left Tasmania to again reside in England, Mrs. W. L. Crowther has been duly elected to occupy the same.

Your Committee desire to place on record the unfailing interest Mrs. Bromby showed in the Institution during her Presidentship.

Information has been received by the authorities of a legacy of £50 from Mr. Warrior's estate, which will, no doubt, appear in the ensuing year's accounts.

The amount earned by the girls during the year is £168 18s. 7d., which shows that there is no diminution in their industry.

£100 (part of which is accrued interest on Debentures) has been carried to the capital account, and has been placed for the present at fixed deposit at 6 per cent.

The health of the children throughout the year has been good.
