



FROM RESIDENTS IN THE DISTRICT OF CULLENSWOOD AGAINST STATE AID TO RELIGION.

Presented by Mr. Button, and ordered by the Council to be printed, 30 September, 1858.



To the Honorable the Legislative Council of Tasmania.

The Petition of the undersigned Residents within the District of Cullenswood, in Tasmania.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That your Petitioners are members of various Religious bodies residing in the District of Cullenswood.

That your Petitioners are taxed, with the rest of the Community, for the propagation of Religious Creeds which are fundamentally opposed.

That your Petitioners believe the system under which hostile Communions are alike maintained by the State in this Colony to be unfavorable to the interests of Religion, unnecessary for its support, as well as unjust in operation, and unsound in principle.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that it may please your Honorable House to abolish all Grants of Money for Ecclesiastical purposes.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.
