

INSPECTOR OF POLICE.

RETURN OF DUTIES.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, July 30, 1873, and ordered by the House to be printed.



A RETURN of all Duties performed by the Inspector of Police, in conjunction with his Offices of Municipal Auditor and Sheriff, from the 1st day of January to the 30th day of June, 1873.

- 1. Exercising the control of and supervision over the Territorial Police Force, directing Police action arising thereout, and conducting correspondence connected therewith in Tasmania and the neighbouring Colonies.
- 2. Inspecting the Police Forces in the Police Districts, and those maintained in the Municipalities of the Colony; and at the same time auditing the Municipal Accounts,—being employed herein upwards of 100 days, and travelling upwards of 1200 miles.
- 3. As Sheriff,—having the control of and supervision over the Penal Establishments of the Colony, with the exception of Port Arthur, and performing the several duties of that office imposed upon me by law.
