PETITION IN REGARD TO APPLICATION FOR LAND.

To the Honorable the President and the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the undersigned respectfully

SHOWETH :

THAT your Petitioners were the original prospectors and applicants for a section of land at the Blue River, County of Dorset, comprising forty acres, situated about five miles in a north-westerly direction from the Full Moon Company's claim, and about fifteen miles from the Mussel Row River.

That your Petitioners find by a tracing obtained from the Lands and Works Office that the block applied for has not been allotted them as defined in the application, but that a Section is marked in the name of the applicant situated in a totally different direction.

Your Petitioners moreover most respectfully submit, that the land lately in dispute between Messrs. Crowther and M'Donald, Bradshaw, and others is the same Lot they (your Petitioners) claim; and they therefore venture to address your Honorable House with a view of obtaining the land originally applied for by them on the eleventh day of September last.
