

Exhibition Buildings, Sydney, 12th April, 1877.

DEAR SIR,

In addition to our functions as Commissioners for Queensland at this Exhibition, we have been empowered by the National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland to arrange for exhibits for the Intercolonial Exhibition to be held in Brisbane in August next.

The admirable illustrations in the Tasmanian court of Colonial industry and art, and of the resources of the soil of Tasmania both on and below its surface, induce us to request that you will make known in the proper quarters the fact of our Exhibition being about to be held, and intimate that the Association is very desirous to see Tasmania represented on the occasion.

The capacious building erected and used last year for the purpose of our first exhibition, which resulted in such remarkable success, will be greatly enlarged; and the arrangements for exhibiting machinery, stock, and other things unsuited to the interior of the main building will include improvements upon those which were used last year, and which gave satisfaction to exhibitors on that occasion.
