- **1** Ms *Rattray* to move That Statutory Rules 2021, No. 93, Nature Conservation (Wildlife) Regulations dated 22 November 2021 made under the *Nature Conservation Act* 2002 and laid upon the Table of the Council on 4 May 2022, be disallowed as provided by Section 47 of the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1931.
- 2 Mr Duigan to move That the Legislative Council —
- (1) Notes that Hydro Tasmania was named as a finalist for the 2021 Clean Energy Council Awards in the Community Engagement category for their COVID-19 Recovery Program to assist Tasmanian communities in overcoming the challenges associated with the pandemic;
- (2) notes that Hydro Tasmania's program had two phases: the Sustain phase reassuring Tasmanians that essential energy generation would continue, while the Recovery phase partnered with community organisations to deliver initiatives to assist hard-hit sectors and vulnerable groups;
- (3) acknowledges that the program enabled community organisations to help more people affected by the pandemic and delivered a range of positive community initiatives across Tasmania; and
- (4) urges Hydro Tasmania to continue it endeavours to fully engage with the Tasmanian community as it develops its ongoing responses to deal with the COVID pandemic.
- 3 Ms Webb to move That a draft proclamation made under Section 11(2) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002, dated 26 May 2022 and laid upon the Table of the Council on 2 June 2022 and which draft proclamation declares areas of Crown land specified in Parts 1 to 10 of Schedule 1 to the draft proclamation to be reserved land, be disallowed in accordance with the provisions of s.18(3) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002.
- **4** Ms Webb to move That a draft proclamation made under Section 11(2) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002, dated 18 May 2022 and laid upon the Table of the Council on 2 June 2022 and which draft proclamation declares area of Crown land specified in Parts 1 to 11 of Schedule 1 to the draft proclamation to be reserved land, be disallowed in accordance with the provisions of s.18(3) of the Nature Conservation Act 2002.
- 5 Mrs *Hiscutt* to move That the Legislative Council —
- (1) Acknowledges the Tasmanian athletes who represented Australia at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games:
- (2) pays tribute to their dedication and hard work in realising their Commonwealth dream;
- (3) congratulates them all on a successful Commonwealth Games campaign with thirteen medals being won by Tasmanian athletes across a range of sports, including ten gold; and
- (4) recognises them as inspirational role models for our young Tasmanian athletes.
- **6** Ms *Armitage* to move That the report of the Auditor-General No. 7 of 2021-22, COVID-19 Response to social impacts: mental health and digital inclusion, be considered and noted.

- 7 Ms *Forrest* to move That the Legislative Council —
- (1) Notes the 160-year history of Public Accounts Committees in Tasmania; and
- (2) recognises the key role of Public Accounts Committees in public sector accountability, ensuring transparency in the scrutiny of government expenditure, service delivery and performance.

- (1) Notes the importance that Neighbourhood Houses play in the economic, social and mental wellbeing of Tasmanians;
- (2) acknowledges the significant role volunteers play within Neighbourhood Houses;
- (3) thanks those that work and volunteer at Neighbourhood Houses for the critical role they play in the wellbeing of the community; and
- (4) commends the Rockliff Liberal Government's recent investment of an additional \$1.75 million, equating to an additional \$50,000 for each of Tasmania's 35 Neighbourhood Houses, to allow Neighbourhood Houses to do more to support those in the community.
