



MUNICIPAL POLICE:

INSPECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1888.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



Police Department, Inspector's Office, Hobart, 23rd July, 1889.

SIR,

I make the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1888, in accordance with Section 7 of "The Police Regulation Act, 1865."

During the year I visited the whole of the Municipalities, and completed the personal inspection of every outstation in the Colony.

The number of officers and men employed in each Municipality was sufficient for the general purposes of police supervision and protection within its borders, and general good order and security prevailed.

The stations were, with a few exceptions, maintained in fairly good order, and many of them are superior buildings, and the charge-rooms, cells, and other such premises occupied for the use of the Police were found to be sufficient, and it appeared to me the provisions of the Police Regulation Act were duly observed and carried into effect.

I append Returns and particulars of the Force relating to each Municipality in the form in which they have been published for many years. There was during the year a very marked diminution of crime and of minor offences.
