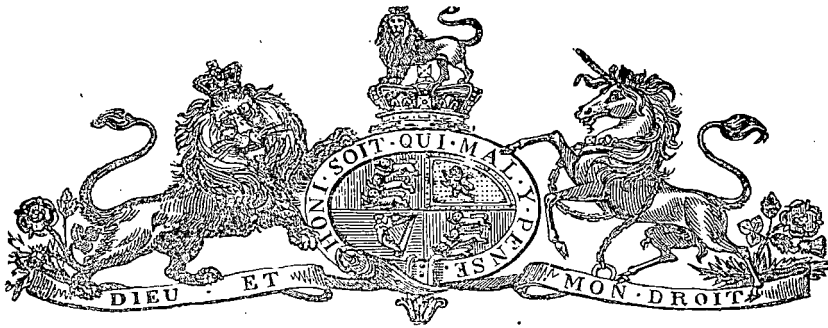

REPORT FOR 1891.

THE Governors have much pleasure in presenting this Second Annual Report, and congratulate the subscribers and public generally on the continued prosperity of the Institution.

The number of patients admitted during the past year has been 53, of which 30 have been from Beaconsfield, 4 from Winkleigh, 4 from Glengarry, 1 from Forrester's Hill, 1 from Frankford, 3 from George Town, 4 from Lefroy, 3 from Ilfracombe, 1 from Exeter, and 2 from Sidmouth— from which it will be seen that the Hospital's capabilities have been fully tested. Only three deaths have occurred during the past year.

The Governors again urge upon those who are not subscribers to become such at once. Many will be saved heavy fees by the payments under Rule III.-2.

Government Grant.

During the year your Board have received the Government subsidy of £150. The like amount having been passed by Parliament for this year, your Board have made application for the same.

New Hospital.

The site of the new Hospital having been granted, and the vote of £300 passed by Parliament on the £ for £ basis, your Board appealed for help to the ladies, who heartily responded by organising a Grand Fancy Fair, which proved a splendid success. This was followed by a Cake and Poultry Fair, together realising over £300 for the New Building Fund. Your Board, on behalf of the people of Beaconsfield, desire to express their deep gratitude to the ladies for their earnest and devoted labours.

Plans of the new Hospital have been prepared, but owing to the £300 not being available until the loan is floated no tenders have been accepted.

Finance.

From the Balance-sheet which is appended it will be seen that the total receipts from all sources have been £654 1s. 8d., and the expenditure £215 15s. 6d., to which must be added a debit balance from 1890 of £73 2s. 10d., leaving a credit balance on all accounts of £365 6s. 4d., besides fees outstanding to the amount of £50.
