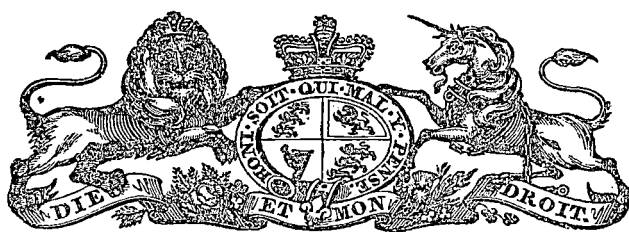

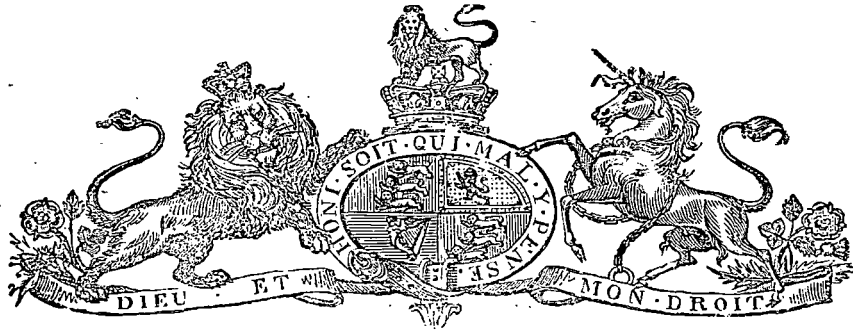

HOBART TOWN GENERAL HOSPITAL.

ANNUAL REPORT for 1871.

THE Board of Management of the Hobart Town General Hospital have the honor to lay before the Government their Report for the year ending 31st December, 1871.

The daily number of Patients in Hospital during 1871 was very nearly the same as in the previous year, but the number of admissions and discharges was greater.

As a large number of cases (*ex. gr.* cases of Chronic Ulcer), which in former years were retained in Hospital, are now forwarded to the Invalid Stations, the atmosphere of the Hospital Wards is much purer; the Patients being thus placed under more favourable conditions for the cure of the diseases from which they are suffering.

The mortality during 1871 was greater by 1 than in 1870, there being 109 in the latter and 110 in the former year; but of these 110, 53—or very nearly one-half—died during the first week after admission, and no less than 41 died on the day of admission, and three following days. 58 of the deaths were Patients over 50 years of age.

The number of paying Patients treated was nearly the same in the two years, but the amount received in 1871 was much larger.

The number of Patients treated at the Dispensary was considerably greater than in 1870; and the quantity of medicines issued, in large excess, nearly ten thousand prescriptions having been made up during the twelve months.

The cost of In-Patients was fourpence per diem each less than in the previous year.

The Board take this opportunity of tendering their thanks to the Honorary Medical Officers for the zeal and efficiency with which they have attended to the Hospital during the year. Thanks are also due to the Honorary Surgeon Dentist for his valuable services.

STATISTICAL REPORT of the Surgeon-Superintendent.

During the past year there were admitted into the Hospital 838 Patients, of whom 587 were males and 251 females.

There were remaining under treatment at the commencement of the year 79; so that the total number treated during the year ending 31st December, 1871, was 917. Of these 733 were discharged, 110 died, and 74 remain under treatment.

Nine persons died on the day of admission, 18 on the day after, 5 on the second day, 9 on the third, 5 on the fourth, 4 on the fifth, and 3 on the sixth day.

Of the Patients admitted 94 were self-supporting, 40 were either wholly or in part chargeable to Imperial Funds, and 783 were Colonial Paupers.

The number of Out-Patients treated during the year was 4970, the number of prescriptions was 9695.
