

TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT of the Inspector of Constabulary Forces of Municipalities of Tasmania for the Year ending 31st December, 1882.

Office of Inspector of Police, 13th July, 1883.

Sir,

I have the honor to furnish, for the information of His Excellency the Governor my Annual Report upon the Municipal Police for 1882.

There was a slight increase in the total strength employed. The addition was made in the Launceston Force, and was warranted by the number of new streets and buildings requiring supervision.

There were fewer indictable offences reported in 1882 than in the previous year, and a smaller number of offences against the Police Act, but the cases of drunkenness had increased materially.

The general standard of efficiency of the Municipal Police was maintained during the year.

In the Country Municipalities readiness to observe the regulations has been generally exhibited, but in Launceston, and latterly in Hobart, attempts have been made to set them aside in favour of an independent line of action. This course, if unchecked, would lead to great complication and difficulty in the detection and arrest of criminals who had taken refuge in other Colonies.

It would be obviously impolitic to permit 21 Superintendents to correspond independently with heads of police departments in the other Colonies; yet if the privilege were conceded to one, it is difficult to know on what principle its general application could be restricted.

The usual Return of Indictable and other Offences is enclosed.

The most remarkable features in the year's returns are the increased number of cases of drunkenness, and the small number of indictable offences reported to the Police.

With regard to the latter returns generally, I may point out that while in some places every offence verbally reported may be recorded, in others inquiry might be made, and if the reports appeared frivolous no further notice would be taken of them.

The proportion between offences reported and the number of arrests cannot therefore be taken as a certain index of police activity.

I very much regret, however, that the Council have not thought it advisable to increase the pay of the Superintendent. £125 per annum is an improper remuneration for the services rendered by that officer. The efficiency of a Police Force may be as much impaired by inadequate pay as by insufficient numbers.
