

ANNUAL REPORT for 1879.

SIR.

In accordance with the Rules of the Hobart Town General Hospital, I have the honor to lay before you the following Annual Report of the affairs of that Institution, together with such information regarding its cost, management, and condition during the year 1879 as will, I trust, afford a satisfactory exposition of all details of importance.

The Hobart Town General Hospital Act, 1878, having come into operation on the 31st December, 1878, the affairs of the Hospital have been administered during the past year by a Board of Management in accordance with the provisions of that Act; the Board consisting of seventeen members,—viz. twelve unofficial and five ex officio, their names being as follows:—

Fifteen Board and fifty-five Committee meetings were held during the year, at all of which the attendance of Members was, without exception, good; while during the same period the Honorary Medical Staff made thirteen hundred and seven professional visits to the wards of the Hospital.

It affords me great pleasure to be able to report that during the past year the Hospital, as a whole, has been worked with great efficiency, and that there is reason to believe that in future a high standard of excellence in this respect will be maintained.

In the Annual Reports for 1877 and 1878 attention was drawn to the very unsatisfactory condition of the old buildings connected with the Hospital, and the wretched accommodation which those buildings afford for the treatment of the sick. I regret to say that no improvement whatever in this direction has been effected during the year.

The improvements introduced into the main building during the early part of last year, by which a complete separation between the lavatories and the water-closets was effected, have proved highly satisfactory.

The arrangements made for a continuous and abundant supply of hot water for all Hospital purposes, reported on as completed and working well at the close of 1878, have continued in operation throughout the year, and have fully answered the purposes for which they were erected.

In the Annual Reports for 1877 and 1878 the urgent necessity for the erection of suitable quarters for the various Officers of the Hospital was pressed on the attention of Government, but, up to the present time, nothing has been done in this matter.

In my Report for 1878 I pointed out the very large expenditure for Medicines, Surgical Appliances, &c. incurred on account of the General Hospital; the average cost under this head for 1877, 1878, and 1879 being £687 per annum; an expenditure, as I pointed out in my Report for last year, far exceeding the wants of this Hospital when considered by itself: and I have now only to recapitulate what I then said; viz.—that owing to the large consumption in this branch of the Hospital service beyond its due limits, this institution should be credited with a much larger sum annually than it has of late years received. I therefore take credit as under, and beg to recommend that the establishments named should be debited with their respective amounts. Her Majesty's Gaol, £40; Cascades Hospital for Insane, £10; Brickfields Male Invalid Depôt, £40; Queen's Asylum Male and Female Invalid Depôt, £60; Drugs, &c. supplied by order of the Medical Attendant to paupers at their own homes, £60; proportion of Dispenser's salary and allowances, £40; making a total of £250, which should be deducted from the gross cost of the Hospital.

In 1878 the annual cost of each occupied bed was £82 14s. 5d., whereas I am glad to be able to state that for 1879 the cost per occupied bed was £72 13s. $6\frac{1}{4}d$.; thus showing a saving of £10 0s. $10\frac{3}{4}d$. per bed per annum in the latter year.
