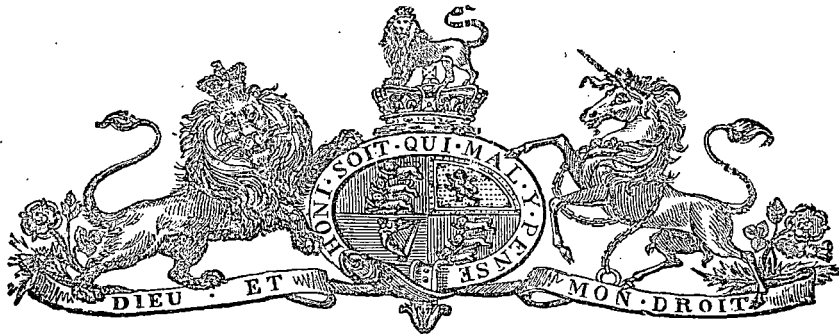

PETITION FROM PORT SORELL FOR REPRODUCTIVE WORKS.

Laid on the Table by Mr. Davies, and ordered by the House to be printed,
27 July, 1865.



To the Honorable the Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the undersigned Landholders of the Western Portion of the District of Port Sorell.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :

THAT your Petitioners regard with much anxiety and alarm the departure from our shores of the Native-born Youths, and of many Colonists who are in a position to depart.

That we believe there is ample scope within the Colony for the exercise of the capital and industry we are thus losing, in consequence of the want of a system of developing our resources by opening Roads to our rich Agricultural Lands.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will be pleased to sanction the expenditure of the amount required by the Government for Public Works in the Country Districts.
