

# ANNUAL REPORT for 1878.

Invalid Depôt, Launceston, 23rd April, 1879.

Sir

I HAVE the honor to submit herewith the Annual Report for this Institution for the year 1878.

On the 1st January, 1878, the number of Inmates was	120 132	
Discharged during the year	110 28	252
·	`	138
Remaining on the 31st December, 1878	•••	114

Of those discharged 4 were transferred to General Hospital, 21 to Cascade Pauper Establishment, 1 to Brickfields Pauper Establishment, 2 to Hospital for Insane, 2 to Police Office for breach of regulations, and 1 absconded.

The daily average number was 121.09.

The average age of Inmates 71.26.

One hundred and eighty-seven cases of sickness were treated during the year.

The average age at the time of death 72 89.

### Inmates.

The majority of the Inmates have become very feeble; it is with difficulty that Wardsmen capable of performing the duties can be selected from among them. Their conduct has been very satisfactory.

#### Resident Overseer.

The Resident Overseer, Mr. William Andrew Parker, who held the office from the 28th November, 1868, was in consequence of infirmity (and has since died) compelled to resign his appointment on the 31st December. He has been succeeded by Mr. Robert Venus.

#### Buildings.

Several of the roofs are in a very bad condition, and will require shingling before next winter. A lavatory and urinals, which were very much needed, have been erected, and have proved of great convenience to the inmates.
