



REPORT of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL, 1871.

THE Trustees in submitting their Annual Report have much pleasure in stating the Hospital continues to be of great benefit to those for whom it was established. There have been 57 cases treated during the year; 8 of which have been accidents requiring immediate attention, including a case of snake-bite, which but for the assistance afforded by the Master of the Hospital might have proved fatal, as one Medical man was ill and the other absent from the township; this proves the advantage of such an Institution in a country district. The number of Deaths have been 4.

We have much pleasure in again acknowledging the unremitting care and attention of Dr. Valentine to the Patients. The Clergy have been most attentive to the Patients belonging to their several denominations; and we have much pleasure in mentioning the kindness and attention of some of the ladies of Campbell Town, and also of gentlemen who visit the Hospital. The Master and Matron still continue to perform their duties in every way satisfactorily.

Mr. Hogg having resigned, Mr. Parker has been appointed to collect subscriptions in aid of the Hospital Funds, which we regret to state continue to fall off to such an extent as to render it doubtful whether the Hospital can be continued under present arrangements; the Trustees have represented this to the Government, asking them to grant the usual aid upon easier terms, but as yet have received no definite reply: twice during the year the Treasurer was unable to pay the quarterly accounts, and is obliged now to make use of subscriptions collected this year to pay accounts to the end of last year, there being at that time a deficiency of about £60.

The Trustees deem it proper to mention the liberality of Mr. Hedges in supplying the Hospital with water, and would urge this method of supporting it upon the attention of the public generally.
