

ANNUAL REPORT of the TASMANIAN COUNCIL OF EDUCATION for the Year 1872-73.

To His Excellency CHARLES DU CANE, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and ^{22 Vict. No.21}. Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Thirteenth Report embracing the Section 30. proceedings of the Council between the 1st May, 1872, and the 30th April, 1873.

2. His Honor Mr. Justice Dobson was elected President for the year ending 30th President. June, 1873.

3. We caused an Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions to be held in the month of June, 1872. Eleven Students presented themselves for examination; and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the value of $\pounds 20$ each were awarded to Algernon Townsend Creswell, pupil of the Rev. J. R. Buckland, Hutchins School, Hobart Town, and Neil Elliot Lewis, pupil of Mr. H. M. Pike, City School, Hobart Town. Of the remaining nine, four obtained a standard of marks sufficient to entitle them to an Exhibition, and three were entitled to the honorable mention of their names.

The Examiners in closing their Report on the Examination observe :--

"We are of opinion that the results of this Examination are very satisfactory. In some former years, before the establishment of a preliminary trial, a larger number of boys offered themselves as competitors. Now that the scale of standards is better understood, very few wish or are advised to ete for the Exhibitions whose attainments fall short of the moderate requirements ascertained compete for the Exhibitions whose attainments fall short of the moderate requirements ascertained by the Preliminary Examination, and the contest is therefore confined to a smaller number of better prepared candidates. On this occasion Hull, the sixth in the race, though he failed in the Mathe-matical subjects, acquitted himself admirably in several others, and reached the standard which would have qualified him for an exhibition. The candidate who has attained the highest place obtained 596 marks out of a maximum of 1200 three years ago, when he was 10 years old, as a competitor for one of the exhibitions offered by the Board of Education. In the following year an Exhibition was awarded to him, and he was removed from the Goulbourn-street Public School to the Hutchins School Last years he was fifth among the accurate for a Council Exhibition charging for marks School. Last year he was fifth among the aspirants for a Council Exhibition, obtaining 655 marks. Still pursuing the same onward course, he has at length achieved another success. His career resembles closely that of Alfred Doran, who attained the highest place last year; and we are of opinion that it is not only very praiseworthy, but that it also reflects honour on the two Schools in which they have both been trained."

4. The Thirteenth Examination of Male Students for the Degree of Associate of Arts Degree of was held in September, 1872; Professor Charles Badham, D.D., of the University of Sydney, being Examiner in English, Latin, Greek, and French; M. H. Irving, Esquire, M.A., Head Master of Wesley College, Melbourne, being Examiner in Mathematics and Natural Philosophy; and His Lordship the Bishop of Tasmania undertaking the Examination in Chemistry. Eleven Candidates presented themselves, of whom nive succeeded in obtaining the Degree,—three being placed in the First Class, one in the Second Class, and five in the Third Class.

5. James William Tibbs, as the Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal, and four Second Prizes of the value of £5 each were awarded to him for English, Latin, Greek, and Mathematics. To William Andrew Reilly, who was placed in the First Class, were awarded four First Prizes of the value of £10 each in English, Latin, Greek, and French. To Francis Leicester Butler, who was also placed in the

Education Exhibitions. Gazette Notice, 2nd July, 1872.

First Class, were awarded the First Prize of the value of £10 for Mathematics, the First Prize of the value of £5 for Natural Philosophy, and a Prize of the value of £2 10s. for Chemistry. To George Llewellyn Meredith was awarded a Prize of the value of £2 10s. for Chemistry.

6. The first Examination of Female Candidates for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in September last, under the Regulations of the Council, dated 25th March, 1872.

7. No provision having been made for the payment of Examiners, we availed ourselves of the gratuitous services of some of the Members of the Council as Examiners in the various subjects, and also of the Rev. C. H. Cope, M.A., and Henry Hunter, Esq.,the former undertaking the Examination in Music, and the latter in Drawing.

8. Nine Candidates presented themselves. Seven passed the Preliminary Examination, and six succeeded in obtaining the Degree, of whom four were placed in the First Class, and two in the Second Class.

9. To Sarah Anne Wilkinson Bourne, who was placed in the First Class, were awarded the Council's Prize of the value of $\pounds 5$ as the Senior Female Associate of the year, and also the Council's Prizes for History and Euclid. To Elizabeth Emily Stileman Dawes, who was also placed in the First Class, were awarded the Council's Prizes for English, for Arithmetic, and for Algebra. Emma Elizabeth Mather, who was also placed in the First Class, received the Council's Prizes for English Literature, and Drawing.

10. The Examination for the Tasmanian Scholarships was held in September last and was conducted by Professor Badham and M. H. Irving, Esq.,—the former under-taking the Classics, Modern History and Language, the latter Mathematics and Natural Philosophy. Two Candidates presented themselves. One—Douglas Edward Stewart, A.A. 1869-reached the standard prescribed by the Council. A Scholarship was awarded to him, and he has proceeded to Great Britain to enter upon his studies at one of the Universities.

11. On the recommendation of the Examiner, Professor Badham, a Prize of Books of the value of £5 was awarded to Douglas Edward Stewart, A.A. 1869, and Tasmanian Scholar, 1871, for Latin Verse Composition.

12. For the Prize of Books of the value of £5 5s., offered through the Council for Latin Essay, on the subject "Quantum adjumenti literarum studium ad rempublicam administrandam afferat?" no compositions were sent in. The offer has been renewed, and the same subject has been fixed for the year 1873.

13. Since the publication of our last Report three Examinations of Candidates for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne have been held in Hobart Town under our supervision.

16. In November last the approval of Your Excellency in Council was obtained to A.A. Degree, the following Regulations for the Examination of Female Candidates for the Degree Female Candidates. of Associate of Arts being substituted for the Regulations dated 25th March, 1872. Gazette Notice, 19th Nov. 1872.

REGULATIONS.

I. The Examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts shall be open to persons of any age; but Candidates for that Degree above the age of twenty-one years shall not be eligible for any Prizes that may be awarded by the Tasmanian Council of Education.

II. In determining the Classes, account will be taken of every part of the Examination; but no credit will be given for knowledge in any subject unless the Candidate attain a Standard of Marks to be fixed by the Council.

III. Every successful Candidate for the Degree of Associate of Arts shall receive a Certificate of having obtained such Degree; and such Certificate shall be on parchment, under the Seal, and signed by the President of the Council. The Certificate shall specify the subjects in which the Candidate has passed, and the Class attained.

IV. The examination, for those students who have satisfactorily passed the preliminary examination, will comprise the subjects mentioned in the following thirteen sections. In four of these, English and one Ancient or Modern Language being essential, the Candidates must satisfy the Examiners :--

1. English. Latin.
 Greek 4. French. 5. German.

7. Pure Mathematics.

6. Italian.

- 8. The Elementary Principles of Hydro-statics and Mechanics. ٠, 9. The Elements of Chemistry. 10. Zoology and Botany. 11. Geology. 12. Drawing.

17. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st Financial January and the 31st December, 1872, the termination of the financial year; together Statement. with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1873. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1872 is shown to have amounted to $\pounds 903$ 11s. 7d., being $\pounds 157$ 8s. 5d. less than the sum voted by Parliament.

18. We append to our Report a Roll of the Tasmanian Scholars, a List of those Appendix Students who have attained the Degree of Associate of Arts, and a List of those who A, B, and C. obtained Exhibitions offered by the Council.
