

TWENTIETH ANNUAL REPORT of the Inspector of Constabulary Forces of Municipalities for the Year ending 30 June, 1878.

Office of Inspector of Police, 7th October, 1878.

I HAVE the honor to furnish my Annual Report on the state of the Municipal Police for the information of His Excellency the Governor.

The total strength on the 30th June was as follows:-

HOBART TOWN,—(Established 1st February, 1858:)

This Force remains unchanged in numerical strength and organisation. Six Constables had resigned.

Indictable offences and offences against the Police Act had increased, but the number of persons charged with drunkenness was the same as last year. 203 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 134 persons were apprehended, of whom 93 were committed for trial, or summarily convicted. 94 males and 66 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 329 males and 189 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. Eleven publicans were proceeded against for breaches of the Licensing Act, and nine of them fined.

An Acting Sub-Inspector acts as Coroner's Clerk and Inspector of Common Lodging-houses. A) medical officer attends the watch-house.

In 1858 Hobart Town had a Force consisting of a Superintendent and 50 men. In 1868 the strength had been reduced to a Superintendent and 37 men, at which state it has since remained.

Serious offences have declined since 1868, when 308 of indictable character were reported. In the year now passed there were 203 only.

There was a decrease in indictable offences, and in the number of persons charged with offences against the Police Act, but an increase in cases of drunkenness and disorderly conduct.

130 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 72 persons were apprehended, 53 of-whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial.

83 males and 74 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 102 males and 32 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

Four publicans were fined for breaches of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Examiner of Weights and Measures, and the Sub-Inspector is Inspector of common Lodging-houses.

The Superintendent had resigned, and another had been appointed.

Five indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which one person was apprehended and committed for trial.

One male was convicted of being drunk. No persons were charged with breaches of the Police Act. No publicans were proceeded against.

The Superintendent also holds the office of Council Clerk.

The police arrangements have not been satisfactorily carried out.

. I had occasion to report in 1877 that there was but one effective man besides the Superintendent, since then the efficiency of that officer had been reduced by his appointment as Council Clerk.

The dissatisfaction and agitation in the District will, I trust, bring about the required improvement, by causing the number of the police to be increased to something like a reasonable strength.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength.

Three indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which one male was apprehended and summarily convicted.

Five males and three females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and three males with offences against the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

The Superintendent is also Council Clerk, Tidewaiter of Customs, Inspector of Roads, and Registrar of the Court of Requests.

A Special Constable had resigned during the year, but the vacancy had not been filled up.

There was a reduction in indictable offences and offences against the Police Act. No persons have been charged with drunkenness for the past two years in this municipality. Nine indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 11 persons were apprehended, 10 of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Six males and three females were charged with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. No proceedings were taken against publicans under the provisions of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is also Council Clerk.

LONGFORD.—(Established 28th February, 1862.)
Strength of Force

There has been no change in the numerical strength of this Force since my last Report.

There was a decrease in the number of indictable offences reported, but an increase in cases of drunkenness and in the number of persons proceeded against under the Police Act and Municipal Byelaws. 21 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 21 persons were apprehended, all of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 111 males and 55 females were charged with being drunk and disorderly, and 58 males and 24 females with offences under the provisions of the Police Act and Municipal Byelaws. Three publicans were fined for breaches of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

GREEN PONDS.—(Established 15th April, 1862.)
Strength of Force

There has been no change in this Force since my last Report.

Indictable offences were the same as last year, but the number of persons charged with drunkenness had increased, while the number of persons charged with offences under the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws had decreased. During the year 17 indictable offences were reported, for which 14 persons were apprehended, 9 of whom were summarily convicted. 24 males and 8 females were charged with being drunk and disorderly, and 23 males and 9 females with offences against the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

The Superintendent is also Council Clerk, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, Town Surveyor, Gaoler, Poundkeeper, and Registrar Court of Requests.

There has been no change in this Force during the year.

Indictable offences were the same as last year. There was an increase in the number of persons charged with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws, but a decrease in the number of persons charged with drunkenness. 12 indictable offences were reported to the Police during the year, for which 6 persons were apprehended, 5 of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. 13 males and 4 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 24 males and 4 females with breaches of the Police Act and Bye-laws. No proceedings were taken against publicans under the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Bailiff of Crown Lands, and Inspector of Stock.

BOTHWELL.—(Established 31st January, 1863.)

Strength of Force

No change has been made in this Force since my last Report. This Force is not, in my opinion, quite strong enough to afford reasonable protection to the property of the inhabitants residing away from the Township of Bothwell.

There was a slight decrease in the number of indictable offences reported to the Police, as well as in the number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, but a considerable increase in the number of persons charged with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. During the year 6 indictable offences were reported, for which 6 persons were apprehended, all of whom were committed for trial. 22 males and 15 females were charged with being drunk and disorderly, and 33 males and 7 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

ROSS.—(Established 17th February, 1863.)

Strength of Force

There has been no change in this Force during the year.

10 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 5 persons were apprehended, all of whom were convicted. 20 males and 7 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 9 males and 3 females with breaches of the Police Act and Bye-laws.

The Superintendent also holds the office of Council Clerk.

FINGAL.—(Established 27th February, 1863.)

Strength of Force

There was no change during the year in the numerical strength of this Force. One Constable had resigned.

There was a considerable reduction in all kinds of offences as compared with last year. 30 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 11 persons were apprehended,—8 of whom were summarily convicted. 32 males and 11 females were charged with drunkenness, and 22 males and 12 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. One publican was fined for a breach of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Bailiff of Crown Lands, Town Surveyor, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

NEW NORFOLK .— (Established 17th March, 1863.)

Strength of Force

There has been no change in the numerical strength of this Force during the year. Two Constables had resigned, and one had been discharged.

Indictable offences had increased but other offences had decreased.

35 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 16 persons were apprehended,—all of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 80 males and 24 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct; 84 males and 22 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

No publicans were proceeded against under the Licensing Act.

HAMILTON.—(Established 13th September, 1863.)

Strength of Force 6

This Force still remains unaltered.

Indictable offences had increased, but other offences had decreased. 17 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 7 persons were apprehended,—4 of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. 16 males and 5 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 35 males and 5 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. One publican was proceeded against for a breach of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Town Surveyor, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Bailiff of the Court of Requests.

BRIGHTON.—(Established 19th November, 1863.)	
Strength of Force—Effectives	4
Specials	1

This Force has been increased by the appointment of a Constable. One Constable had been dismissed, and another had resigned.

17 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 12 persons were apprehended,—all of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. 42 males and 10 females were charged with being drunk and disorderly, and 45 males and 16 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. Three publicans were fined under the provisions of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Bailiff of Crown Lands, Town Surveyor, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

One Constable had resigned.

There was an increase in the number of indictable offences, but a decrease in other offences. 50 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 17 persons were apprehended, 13 of whom were summarily convicted. 103 males and 26 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 43 males and 11 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Poundkeeper.

The numerical strength of this Force remains unaltered.

There was an increase in the number of persons charged with drunkenness, and with offences against the Police Act, but a decrease in the number of indictable offences reported. 46 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 20 persons were apprehended, 13 of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 54 males and 24 females were charged with being drunk and disorderly, and 23 males and 2 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws.

One publican was fined for a breach of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Bailiff of Crown Lands, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

EVANDALE.—(Established 29th December, 1865.)
Strength of Force

No change has been made in this Force since my last Report.

Indictable offences were the same as last year, but there was an increase in the number of persons charged with drunkenness, and with offences against the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. 8 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 6 persons were apprehended, all of whom were convicted. 34 males and 4 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 52 males and 5 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. No proceedings were taken against publicans under the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is also Council Clerk.

This Force has been reduced by one Special Constable.

Indictable offences and the number of persons charged with drunkenness had increased, but the number of persons charged with breaches of the Police Act had decreased. 47 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 41 persons were apprehended, 35 of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 24 males and 17 females were convicted of being drunk and disorderly, and 15 males and 18 females with breaches of the Police Act and Bye-laws. No proceedings were taken against publicans under the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is also Council Clerk.

I consider that two additional Constables are required.

There were no resignations or dismissals from this Force during the year.

There was an increase in the number of persons charged with breaches of the Police Act and Byelaws, but a decrease in other offences. 12 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 10 persons were apprehended, all of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 5 males and 5 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 50 males and 9 females with offences against the Police Act and Bye-laws. Five publicans were charged with breaches of the Licensing Act and fined.

The Superintendent is Council Clerk and Registrar of the Court of Requests. The Sub-Inspector is Bailiff of the Court of Requests.

OATLANDS.—(Established 9th January, 1862.)

A Special Constable had been appointed to this Force since my last Report, with a salary of £5 per annum. A Sub-Inspector had been dismissed for misconduct.

Indictable offences and offences under the Police Act were about the same as last year, but the number of persons charged with drunkenness had decreased. During the year 30 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 4 persons were apprehended, all of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 22 males and 10 females were charged with being drunk and disorderly, and 20 males and 9 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. One publican was convicted of a breach of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Bailiff of the Court of Requests, Town Surveyor, Inspector of Stock, and Crown Bailiff.

No change has been made in this Force during the past two years.

Indictable offences and offences against the Police Act had increased, but drunkenness had decreased. 25 indictable offences were reported, for which 18 persons were apprehended, 10 of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 37 males and 12 females were charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, and 59 males and 6 females with breaches of the Police Act and Municipal Bye-laws. One publican had been fined for a breach of the Licensing Act.

The Superintendent is Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Town Surveyor. A Sub-Inspector is Bailiff of the Court of Requests.
