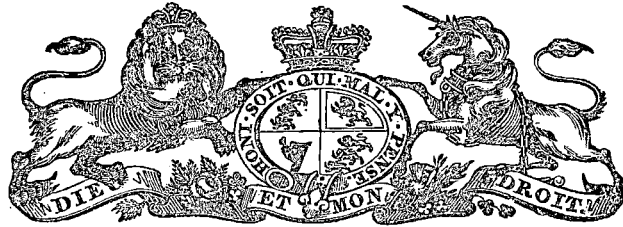

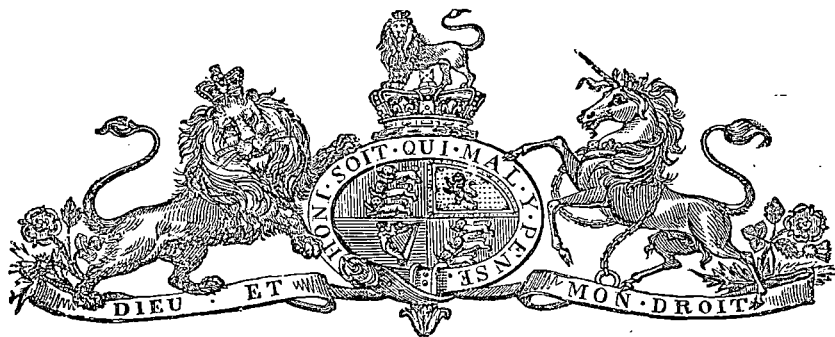

SIR,

I HAVE the honor of enclosing Catalogue of Sale of Hops, &c., and beg to direct your attention to a pencil memo. in last page made by me at the time.

I caused a large quantity of gas water to be procured from the Gas Works, which water was put over the Hops at the Bonding Warehouse, after which they were carted to my garden, where they now lie mixed with night-soil and sand.

The water was put on the Hops by Robert M'Clement, cooper at the Bond.

## PENCIL MEMO.

THE Hops after being put up for H.C. and exportation were destroyed with gas water, and carted to my garden, where they were mixed with night soil and sand, and converted into manure.
