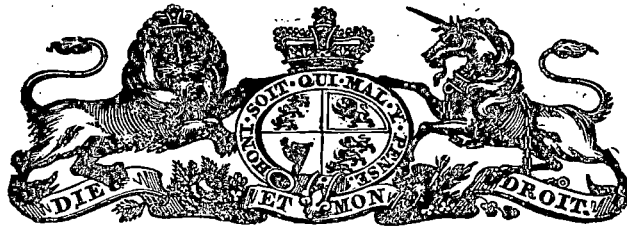

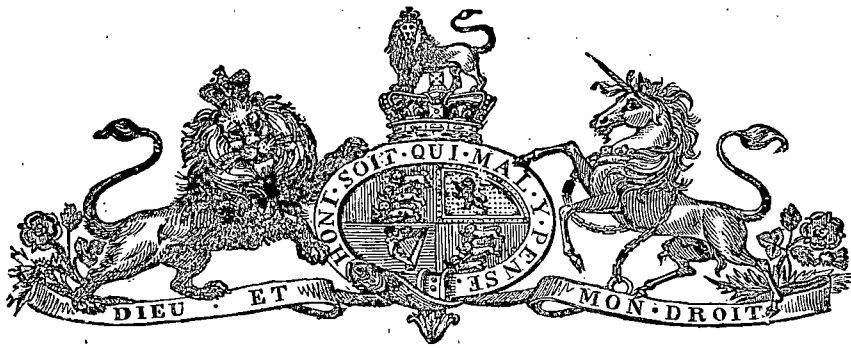

REPORT of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL, 1872.

THE Trustees in submitting their Annual Report beg to state that the Hospital still maintains its usefulness, and proof is afforded of the necessity of such an institution by the fact that latterly some patients have had to be removed before recovery to make room for more urgent cases; but the Trustees regret to say the funds are in such an unsatisfactory state that the efficiency of the Institution will be materially impaired: indeed, unless subscriptions are more liberal, they will not be in a position to apply for the usual Government aid, without which it would be utterly impossible to maintain it. It will be remembered that at the close of the year 1871 there was a deficiency of about £60, which was met by subscriptions collected in January 1872; but now the funds are exhausted, and there are accounts to the amount of nearly £70 unpaid, exclusive of current expenses since the 1st January. There has been no change made in the Officers of the Hospital, and their duties have been performed in the usual satisfactory manner. We have much pleasure in acknowledging Dr. Valentine's care and attention, and also that of the Clergy, to the spiritual wants of the patients. The balance sheet has been prepared in a more detailed form, in order to show precisely the state of the accounts on the 1st February, 1873; and the Trustees earnestly appeal to the Public for liberal subscriptions that so necessary and valuable an Institution may not be closed.
