



TIMBER LICENCES.

Return of Amount collected in the Electoral Districts of Kingborough, Queenborough, and Franklin during the Years 1864, 1865, 1866, and up to 30th June, 1867.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, 6 September, 1867.



MEMORANDUM.

Survey Office, 3rd September, 1867.

THE information asked for by the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer is herewith forwarded.

The Timber Licence Fees were reduced in October, 1866, from 2s. 6d. to 1s. per week; and, consequently, the fees which are now collected only represent £300 a year: whereas, had the reduction not been made, the amount would have been £750.

Presuming the information required by the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer has some connection with the duties performed by Mr. Laffer in the Huon District, I think it necessary to point out to Mr. Chapman that the Inspector of Timber Licences is not solely engaged in the collection of Timber Licence Fees: his services have saved the Government many pounds, inasmuch as he has been called upon to make reports upon good land and timber in the District, encroachments, &c., which—had the District Surveyor been employed—would have entailed an expense of £2 2s. per diem for every day he was engaged upon the work.

Two works are now going on under Mr. Laffer's supervision; viz.—the cutting of Tracks to ascertain the extent of good land at the back of the Township of Gordon at Three Hut Point, and also in the vicinity of Dr. Crowther's establishment at Oyster Cove.

Mr. Laffer's designation should, in justice to himself, be altered: he is not only Inspector of Timber Licences, but a general referee for all sorts of questions appertaining to his District; and he has been employed by the Public Works Department in connection with the Scheme of Reproductive Works.

When the office of Inspector of Timber Licences was abolished the fees dwindled down to £173 15s. for the year 1858, and to £157 15s. for 1859, whereas the year following the appointment they rose at once to £575 2s. 6d.: this alone is a convincing proof of the necessity for having such an officer as Mr. Laffer in the Huon District; and, instead of calling him Inspector of Timber Licences, it would be more correct to designate him either Inspector or Agent for the Huon District.
