

BOARD OF IMMIGRATION:

REPORT FOR 1876.

Immigration Office, 20th April, 1877.

The Board of Immigration have the honor to forward their Annual Report for the year ended 31st December, 1876.

There was an increase in the number of Immigrants introduced under the Bounty System as compared with the previous year.

They consisted of eight married males and eight married females, six single males and six single females, ten male and ten female children, in all forty-eight souls, and the cost to the Board was three hundred and sixty-four pounds.

Land Certificates were granted to thirty-seven individuals under the 7th Section of the Act of Parliament 31 Vict. No. 26, entitling them to select two thousand one hundred and ninety acres of land.

These Certificates represent thirty-three male and twenty-three female adults, and seventy-one children,—in all one hundred and twenty-seven souls.

There were also issued five Land Orders, under the 5th Section of the same Act, entitling the holders to select two hundred and sixty-one acres of land, and representing six male and five female adult Immigrants and seven children.

During the year the Board issued three family, seven male and nine female Bounty Tickets, receiving the sum of one hundred and sixty pounds in payment.

The Emigrant and Colonist's Aid Corporation (Limited), of No. 25, Queen Anne's Gate, Westminster, continue to act as Agents for the Board, involving only a comparatively small expenditure; but the Board having in view the limited funds at their disposal, have not felt warranted in sanctioning such an outlay as would secure the special services of a gentleman competent to discharge the duties of Emigration Agent for the Colony throughout the United Kingdom.

The balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December amounted to £6011 9s. 4d.

Appended are the usual Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent; five relating to the operations of the Board under the Bounty System, and two to transactions under the Acts 31 Vict. No. 26, and 38 Vict. No. 16.

A statement is also appended showing the acreage taken up by the holders of Land Certificates and Land Order Warrants since the date of the last report.
