- The Minister for Energy and Emissions Reductions to move—That the House:—
  - (1) Recognises Entura's Spatial and Data Services Team has received top accolades at the 2021 Asia-Pacific Spatial Excellence Awards for their work on Hydro Tasmania's 'Battery of the Nation' initiative.
  - (2) Notes that:—
    - (a) the team won the Spatial Industries Business Association and Geospatial Information & Technology Association (SIBA/GITA) Award for Spatial Enablement:
    - (b) the team has been involved in 'Battery of the Nation' since its inception, using spatial tools and technologies to support the initiative through pre-feasibility, feasibility and project design stages;
    - (c) 'Battery of the Nation' aims to harness Tasmania's hydropower through new pumped hydro development, optimising existing assets and redeveloping the Tarraleah hydropower scheme;
    - (d) alongside further interconnection through Marinus Link, this will enable Tasmania to play a significant role in the National Electricity Market and support Tasmania's accelerating renewable energy transition. (13 October 2021)
- The Minister for Veterans' Affairs to move—That the House:—
  - (1) Recognises that Veterans' Health Week is being held from 16 October 24 October 2021.
