NOTES ON CLAUSES

- Clause 1 This clause provides for the title of the Act to be the Consolidated Fund Appropriation (Supplementary Appropriation for 2007-2008) Act 2008.
- Clause 2 The Act is taken to have commenced on 1 July 2007.
- Clause 3 This clause provides for the appropriation of \$482 250 000 from the Consolidated Fund.
- Clause 4 (1) The sum of \$312 900 000 is to be applied to Division 3 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Consolidated Fund Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2007, Finance-General, representing a Works and Services appropriation for the purpose of making a contribution to an account in the Special Deposits and Trust Fund titled the Infrastructure Tasmania Fund.
 - (2) The sum of \$75 000 000 is to be applied to Division 3 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Consolidated Fund Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2007, Finance-General, representing a Works and Services appropriation for the purpose of making a contribution to an account in the Special Deposits and Trust Fund titled the Hospitals Capital Fund.
 - (3) The sum of \$60 000 000 is to be applied to Division 3 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Consolidated Fund Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2007, Finance-General, representing a Works and Services appropriation for the purpose of making a contribution to an account in the Special Deposits and Trust Fund titled the Housing Fund.
 - (4) The sum of \$25 200 000 is to be applied to Division 3 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Consolidated Fund Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2007, Finance-General, representing a Works and Services appropriation.
 - (5) The sum of \$5 900 000 is to be applied to Division 4 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Consolidated Fund Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2007, Department of Health and Human Services, representing a Works and Services appropriation.

(6) The sum of \$3 250 000 is to be applied to Division 10 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Consolidated Fund Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2007, Department of Primary Industries and Water, representing a Recurrent Services appropriation.
