1 I am appalled at actions taken by Biosecurity Tasmania in relation to blueberry rust outbreaks in 2014 – 16, it appears that the bigger you are the more rules are bent for you, but not for the small individual growers. Is this corruption, government pressure or pure incompetence?

As I grow chemical free (not Organic) I don't believe the blueberry rust is a problem ,it all comes back to soil & plant health. If plants have a Brix Level (sugar level) higher than 12 your plants will be resistant insect & disease ,the higher brix level, more resistance. Mine have had readings between 25 -30 meaning they are bullet proof except for wind.

We have known for decades that minerals & trace elements are required in certain ratios for optimum plant health along with beneficial bacteria & fungi, but this information has been drowned out by propaganda from chemical and fertiliser company's.
