I wish to object to the Hobart stadium proposal

- 1. The case for another stadium to support AFL matches in Tasmania has not been made. At this stage it remains wishful thinking only.
- 2. The project has been moved to prominence as a result of arrogant demands of the AFL organization which is not a representative body for Tasmania. Support for the AFL demand has not been tested in Tasmanian electorates.
- 3.A small group of influential individuals, including some State politicians, has spent a great deal of money using consultants and advertising entities to support the proposal. As a tactic, the proposal has been manipulated into running several themes which serve to defuse attention on specific details of the proposal. i.e.
 - (a) A stadium to ensure the support of AFL in the establishment of a Tasmanian AFL team. (*Comment; blackmail*)
 - (b) a stadium area intended to attract business and tourism in the city of Hobart. (Comment; This is in design-conflict with that of a sports' stadium.)
 - (c) a stadium to generate income for the State via argument based on much larger cities and population-catchment statistics. (Comment; Selective statistics)
- 4. Macquarie Point was identified, and planned, years ago as a valuable asset in which to develop an extensive community-focused precinct. Such a project would add to the attractiveness of Hobart and Tasmania as a tourism venue, for local visitors and for residents. To replace that focus with a monument to sport ignores the potential of the last significant and attractive area of land in Hobart.
