Dear Kim and Anne

We are advised that the Board of the Macquarie Point Development Corporation (**'Corporation'**) is meeting shortly to approve the commencement of the Request for Tender process to procure a builder for the development of the Macquarie Point Multipurpose Stadium (**'Stadium'**).

We understand that as part of this process, the Corporation is seeking confirmation from Cricket Tasmania and Cricket Australia (**'Cricket'**) that the current design of the Stadium meets international and domestic cricket requirements.

We can confirm that Cricket has been given access to:

- the draft Stadium Design Brief as well as the accompanying General Arrangement drawings intended to be distributed by the Corporation as part of the tender process; and
- the latest Comments Register and Cricket Guidelines Compliance Register. We understand that the Corporation will prioritise closing out all outstanding comments on both the Cricket and Broadcast Comments Registers.

Cricket confirms it is supportive of the current design and the progression to the Request for Tender stage, subject to the resolution of the outstanding comments below:

- training lights - confirmation of the required lux levels for pink ball cricket (1,800-2,000 Lux);
- final design of the media and broadcast facilities, including Green Rooms, storage overlay and circulation allowance in the media box seating plats;
- resolution of outstanding broadcast issues (as per relevant Comments Register), including vibration in the northern camera deck as well as suitable access for crew and equipment to the primary and secondary camera decks;
- understanding of the plan to assess options for patron (summer sun) shade as required;
- compliance with the required technical specification, including the resolution and refresh rate of LED screens and LED ribbon board signage; and
- final design for premium product layout flexibility in the Goods Shed (space dividing mechanism and alternate entry point).

We understand that several of these items have been or are close to being settled between Cricket and the Corporation.

We would like to take the opportunity to commend the Stadium Project Team on the design and delivery of the Roof Test Rig which has facilitated specific playability testing in simulated lighting (full and direct sunlight) conditions. There has been a strong level of acceptance from participants to

date that took part in the testing program, particularly in relation to the impact of any inconsistent light under the roof material when using all three coloured balls.

In line with the roof testing, we also strongly support the work on the impact on loss of light (and potentially loss of play) under the preferred roof material in low natural light conditions and on red ball cricket at the end of the day.

Critically, however, any final expression of satisfaction by Cricket with the current Stadium roof design remains subject to further user acceptance of the roof structure and product via testing undertaken relating to:

- turf health (outfield and cricket pitch), noting that such turf testing will take place on a date and at a location to be determined; and
- the outcomes of the additional low natural light impact studies.

This aligns with the Heads of Agreement between the Tasmanian Government and Cricket (executed on 10 June 2025), and the commitment to resolve to the satisfaction of all relevant parties the final design specifications for the Stadium roof.

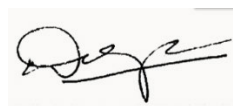
