SIR.

I have the honor to submit this my Annual Report for this Establishment for the year 1885:—

Admissions and Discharges.

Admissions.—The admissions were 14 more than the previous year. The daily average number of inmates was 150·2, of which 147·12 were chargeable to the Colonial Government, and 3·07 to Imperial Fund. The daily average for 1884 was 147·47.

Discharges.—12 were transferred to the General Hospital, 10 to the Police for breaches of the Regulations, 5 absconded, and 43 were discharged by approval of the Administrator of Charitable Grants.

Mortality.—The death rate was 9.627 per cent., as against 11.075 for 1884. The average age at death was 73.464, the maximum being 89, and the minimum 45. The united ages of 16 oldest who died was 1312, being an average of 82.0.

Ages.—The average age of inmates was 67.70, inclusive of 5 between twenty-six and fifty-one.

Religion.—224 were Protestants, and 98 Roman Catholics; of those remaining on the 31st December, 118 were Protestants and 31 Roman Catholics.

Cost.—The gross expenditure for the year was £2294 0s. 7d., being an excess over estimates of £127 12s. 3d. The annual cost per head on gross expenditure was £15 5s. $5\frac{1}{2}d$., and £14 19s. $0\frac{1}{4}d$. on the net expenditure. The cost for 1884 was £15 7s. $6\frac{1}{2}d$., and £14 16s. $10\frac{2}{3}d$. respectively. This will bear favourable comparison with the Benevolent Society of Melbourne. There they had a daily average of 625, the cost of maintenance being £15 10s. 6d. per head per annum.

General Remarks.—The conduct of the inmates has been very satisfactory. The difficulty of obtaining suitable persons as Wardsmen from amongst the inmates still continues, very few of those remaining in the establishment being capable of performing light work.

I am pleased to be able to report that interest continues to be taken in the temporal and spiritual welfare of the inmates by those ladies and gentlemen referred to in my last Report. Thanks are due to Messrs. Walch Brothers and Birchall and several gentlemen for the supply of newspapers and periodicals for the use of the inmates.
