SIR,

I HAVE the honor to forward for your information the following particulars with reference to the work of the Department for the Year ending 31st May, 1895.

The total expenditure for the year has been £110,016 4s. 9d., made up as follows:—

This is about £16,000 less than the year ending 31st May, 1894.

The works at State School, South Launceston, and Hospital, Zeehan, referred to in the Engineer-in-Chief's last Report as being then well advanced, have been completed. The other works carried out during the year have, with a few exceptions, been of an ordinary character, the contracts being principally for small amounts—the exceptions have been the undermentioned:—

Temporary bridge over River Tamar, Launceston.

New school, West Zeehan.

New State school, Upper Macquarie-street, (almost completed).

Alterations Post and Telegraph Offices, Hobart.

New Registry Office, Franklin Square, Hobart.

Jetty, Mersey River, (under Marine Board).

The works on Roads and Bridges have been supervised by the two Divisional Inspectors—Mr. J. Helmer in the South, and Mr. G. Simmons in the North, assisted by Local Inspectors. These officers report that, with few exceptions, the contractors have done their work with reasonable despatch, and in a creditable manner. In order to meet the demand for work by unemployed in country districts small contracts have been let in many cases to local workmen, tenders being invited by notices posted up at public places, and this practice has been attended with very satisfactory results.

A large expenditure has been incurred by day labour (the maximum rate paid being four shillings per day, excepting at the West Coast, where five shillings per day has been paid), in connection with relief works for the unemployed. Where practicable, piecework has been given to the men, the prices being fixed by the officers of the Department, and it is reported that the work thus performed has given general satisfaction. The total expenditure for day labour and piece-work during the year has been £21,066 13s. 8d., and the particulars of works so carried out are given in Table B. attached hereto. I am pleased to state that the reports from the Inspecting Officers as to the character and cost of the work done by the unemployed have been highly satisfactory, both in the North and South. There has been but little occasion for complaint, the men being eager for work, and behaving themselves well, with the exception of say half a dozen cases in the early stages. The difficulty with respect to the unemployed has been far greater in the South than in the North, and from the details given in Table B. it will be seen that the sum of £15,484 5s. 9d. has been expended in the South and West, and only £5582 7s. 11d. in the North in this manner. Hence, the votes for works in the South are now nearly exhausted, as a work which would have lasted for several months under the contract system has been completed in as many weeks by day labour.

The Department has had a large amount of office work in connection with the "unemployed," both in regard to the continuance of the Labour Bureau system and the payment of weekly and fortnightly wages—weekly payments having in numerous instances also to be made to the wives of the men.

The satisfactory character of the work done by the men has, I am sure, been principally due to the fact that thoroughly good working overseers have been employed, and it has been pleasing to receive from time to time satisfactory testimony from private individuals as to the good work done.

The works in connection with buildings have been carried out under the supervision of the Inspector of Public Buildings, Mr. J. G. Shield, assisted by Clerk of Works, Hobart, Clerk of Works, Zeehan, and in the north by Mr. H. N. Taylor; Mr. Taylor's services were, however, dispensed with upon the completion of the works at the new State School, South Launceston.

In addition to the large buildings previously referred to, the following building works have been undertaken during the year:—

- Zeehan and Dundas Hospital, fencing, fitting, &c. (now in progress.)
- New State School, Upper Macquarie-street, outbuildings, fencing, drainage, &c. (plans for which are now ready).
- New School at Paradise.
- New School and Teacher's Residence at Black Hills (near New Norfolk.)
- Teacher's Residence, Mathinna.
- Additions and repairs to School Buildings:—East Devonport, Lebrina, St. Leonard's.
- Conversion of building formerly used as Post and Telegraph Office at Strahan into a School and Teacher's Residence.
- Repairs to School and various Public Buildings in Town and Country Districts, severally:—
- New Police Buildings at Teepookana (King River), West Coast, and Gormanston, (Mount Lyell).
- New Cells, Sandy Bay, Hobart.
- Additions, alterations, and repairs at following Police Stations:—Gladstone, Carnarvon, Strahan, Zeehan, Gordon, Woodbridge, Leslie, Port Cygnet, Forth, Sprent.
- New Cells, Female Division, H.M. Gaol, Hobart.
- Considerable alterations to Buildings, Liverpool-street, Hobart, (formerly Nurses' Home), to convert same into Police Court and Offices for the Territorial Police.
- New Post and Telegraph Office at Gormanston (Mount Lyell).
- Repairs and alterations to Post and Telegraph Offices at Wynyard, Oatlands, Huonville.
- Extensive alterations Public Buildings, Macquarie-street, Hobart, to provide accommodation for combined Offices, Post and Telegraph Department.
- Alterations to front balustrading of Supreme Court, Hobart.
- Usual repairs to Government House and other Public Buildings and Institutions, Hobart.

The payments to Launceston and Mersey Marine Boards for works carried out under the direction of the said Boards in improvements Tamar and Mersey Rivers have been £1144 15s. 7d. and £2800 respectively. The provision made by Parliament for Tamar Improvements, Launceston, has now been expended, and the balance unexpended for the River Mersey works is £3200.

The expenditure under the Crown Lands Act has been continued in the usual way by small contracts and day labour, the amount expended during the year being about £5000 less than last year. The applications by selectors have, however, always been met when funds were due to the localities.

I desire to call attention to the fact that, although the Table C. attached shows that £47,000 is available under the Act, yet this sum is subject to considerable reductions, as—

1. The actual amounts available for expenditure in each locality are determined after inspection and report by an officer of the Department, when it is ascertained to what extent the requirements of the Act have been complied with in respect to "residence" or "improvements."
2. In some cases the actual requirements of the locality have already been met by expenditure under special votes of Parliament, and further expenditure is therefore not required.
3. In many cases expenditure is deferred owing to the scattered character of the selections and difficult nature of the country.

Table C. shows the localities where expenditure has been incurred in excess of the funds due to the respective localities, caused by the recent forfeiture of selections, the expenditure having been incurred prior to such forfeiture. Should these lots be re-selected or other lands taken up which will be benefited by the expenditure already incurred, then these excesses will be reduced by the amount which will become available to such selections.

Table D. attached shows total expenditure and liabilities to 31st May, 1895, on account of Railways and Special Public Works since 1856; and Table E. shows separately cost of Railway Construction.

Re Available Balances for further Works.

I desire to point out that the amounts at present available for special Public Works will (after deducting the votes for Railways and other large works now deferred) at the present rate of expenditure, say £7500 a month, be absorbed in about twelve months from 1st June last.
