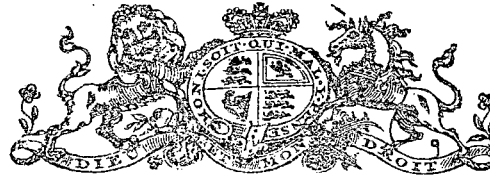

N.B.—For the years 1853, 1854, and 1855, Quit Rents prior to 1st April, 1846, two-thirds of Collections for Redemption of ditto, moiety of Fines and Grants, Fees on Grants, and Office Fees of Commissioners of Titles, formed part of Inland Revenue. During the years 1856 and 1857, respectively, the Land and Inland Revenues were consolidated. Since January, 1858, Land Revenue kept distinct.

(a) Sale of Postage Stamps commenced November, 1855. Postage on letters increased 1st March, 1858, and reduced 1st January, 1859.

(b) Dog Registration increased from 1s. to 5s., 1st April, 1858, and not collected as Rural Municipalities extend.

(c) The cause of the increase in the Rural Police Rate for 1862 is that a portion thereof belongs to former years. As Rural Municipalities extend this Rate not collected.

(d) In 1854 extension of Public-house Licences for the last three months of that year at £10. In 1855 Public-house Licences increased to £50, in 1859 reduced to £37 10s., and in 1861 reduced to £25.

(e) In 1855 Wholesale Licences increased from £10 to £50, subsequently reduced in 1859 to £37 10s., and in 1861 to £25.

(f) Fees on obtaining Probate and Letters of Administration only. Act came into operation 1858.

(g) Medical Treatment, Hospital for Insane, Work performed at Penal Establishments, Hospital Stoppages, Maintenance of Children Queen's Asylum.
