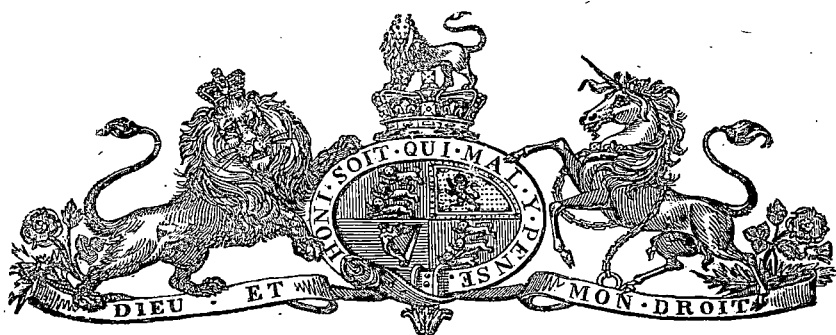

*To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in
Parliament assembled.*

The humble Petition of William Barlow, late Schoolmaster under the Board of Education.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :

THAT the School of which your Petitioner was Master was abolished : that no equivalent appointment having been tendered to him, your Petitioner had no alternative but to retire on superannuation. The Act of your Honorable House, No. 15, 4th October, 1860, clause five, was framed by your Honorable House to meet cases of loss to the Civil Servants of the Government. Your Petitioner, therefore, humbly prays that your Honorable House will be pleased to take this Petition into consideration, and grant your Petitioner relief under clauses one and five of "The Superannuation Act," passed by your Honorable House, that equity may be done to your Petitioner.

And your Petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
