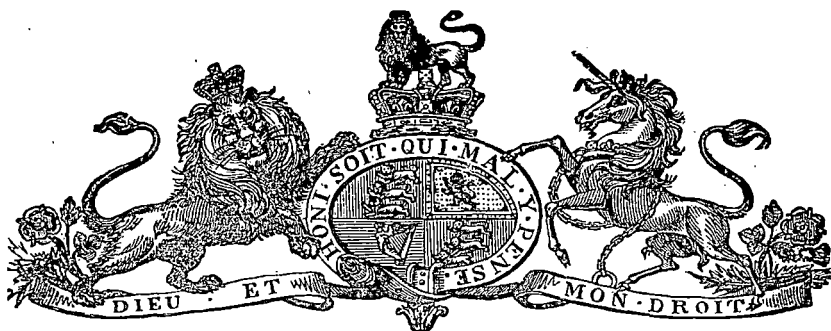

REPORT of the BOARD OF EDUCATION for the Year 1883.

To His Excellency SIR GEORGE CUMINE STRAHAN, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, &c., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. WE, the Members of the Board of Education, Tasmania, have the honor to submit the following Report of our proceedings for the year 1883.

2. *Attendance.*—During the year 1883 there were 183 Schools in operation; the total number of distinct children on the Rolls for the year was 14,241; the average number on the Rolls from month to month was 9708, and the average daily attendance 7040. As compared with the previous year the number of Schools has increased by 2, the total number of children on the Rolls by 466, the average number on the Rolls by 406, and the average daily attendance by 329.

3. *Progress of Schools.*—The progress of the Schools since the year 1863, when the jurisdiction of the present Board was extended over the whole of the Public Schools of the Colony, is shown in the following Table :—

13. *Night Schools for Males*.—We append a Return of the number of scholars admitted into the Night Schools for Males during the year. The sum of £4 1s. has been paid by the Board for their instruction. (See Appendix H.)

14. *Schools established.*—Schools at the following places were established during the year:—Chudleigh, Gladstone, Green's Creek, Mauriceton, Parkham, Sidmouth. The School at Thomas's Plains was re-opened after having been temporarily closed.

15. *Schools closed.*—Aid was withdrawn from the Schools at Early Rises, Ellerslie, and Muddy Plains, on account of the small number of children in attendance; and the School at Upper Huon was temporarily closed during the year.

16. *Board of Education Exhibitions.*—In the month of June we caused an Examination for Exhibitions to be held. Fourteen male and seven female Candidates presented themselves; and on the recommendation of the Examiners, we awarded an Exhibition of the value of £16 13s. 4d. per annum, tenable for four years at a superior School from the 1st of July, 1883, to each of the under-mentioned Candidates:—

17. *General and Local Inspection.*—On summarising Appendix L. it will be seen that 4260 visits have been made to the Public Schools during the year, of which 493 were made by the Inspectors, 1449 by Members of the Local Boards, and 1562 by other persons; and for the purpose of imparting Religious Instruction, 605 visits were made by Ministers of the Church of England, 128 by Ministers of the Church of Rome, 2 by Wesleyan Ministers, 20 by Ministers of the Independent Church, and 1 by a Minister of the Church of Scotland.

18. *Rules and Regulations.*—During the year we have made the following addition to our Rules, which has received the sanction of Your Excellency in Council, and been published in the *Gazette* in accordance with the terms of the 8th Section of "The Public Schools Act," 32 Vict. No. 14:—

Female Assistant Teachers' Salaries.

In accordance with the conditions laid down in the last paragraph of the 67th Section of the Board's Rules and Regulations, it is hereby notified that from the 1st of January, 1883, the Salaries of Female Assistants may be, in cases approved by the Board, supplemented by the addition of Ten per centum of the gross School Fees received by the Head Teacher.

To enable a Female Assistant to claim this allowance she must possess a Certificate of having passed an examination to the satisfaction of the Board, and of competency in general School Management.

That the Head Teacher transmit to the Chairman of the Central Board Ten per centum of the School Fees received by him during the quarter within ten days after the expiration of such quarter, and that the fees thus received be paid over by the Board to the Assistant Teacher entitled to receive same.

19. The Annual Reports of the Chief Inspector of Schools and of Mr. Inspector Rule are annexed. (See Appendices A. and B.) We have not been furnished with a report from Mr. Inspector Doran in consequence of his illness.

20. We submit this as our Report on the Public Schools for the year ended 31st December, 1883, and we have caused our corporate Seal to be affixed hereto.

APPENDIX A.

GENERAL Report for 1883, by T. STEPHENS, Esq., M.A., Chief Inspector of Schools.

Hobart, 9th May, 1884

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to submit my General Report for the year ended 31st December, 1883.

To the Schools in the Southern Districts, to which my work outside the office was chiefly confined, I paid 181 visits of inspection or examination, the particulars of which have been communicated in my separate Reports. Two of the Schools were visited only once, their operation having been suspended during the latter portion of the year, and two others I was unable to examine at the appointed time in consequence of a sudden attack of illness. The rest of the Schools were visited twice or oftener. The examinations of candidates for employment and for the Exhibitions annually awarded by the Board, and of Teachers and Pupil Teachers, together with the visits paid to various places on special business, occupied 50 days, and the rest of my time was fully occupied with miscellaneous duties at head quarters. The increasing demands upon my time in connection with duties outside the routine work of an Inspector have left little leisure for the consideration of questions affecting the general control of school business, and the initiation of improvements in the system of primary instruction administered by the Board.

Considerable progress has been made during the year in the erection, improvement, and repair of School-houses. Of the two principal buildings under this head, the Schools in Launceston and at Battery Point, Hobart, I may say that, when completed, they will afford such opportunities for the proper conduct of large Schools as have never before existed in Tasmania; and though the area available for playgrounds is somewhat restricted owing to the smallness of the site in the one case, and to the unfortunate excavation of a part of the ground in the other, which necessitated the erection of the buildings on the street level, there will be no serious impediment to the provision of sufficient space for recreation for many years to come. The new Schools in the rural districts, so far as they have come under my observation, provide well planned School-rooms, and are in some instances a vast improvement upon the rude and temporary buildings which we have often had to make use of. Whether the cost of construction is in all cases warranted, either by the nature of the accommodation afforded for the teachers, or by the number of children likely to be brought within their walls, is a question which will soon demand serious attention. It does not require a prophet to foretell the natural consequences of relegating to the State the duty of providing institutions which every parent desires to see established close to his own door; nor is it difficult to see that unless the strictest economy is maintained in the expenditure of building grants, there will be some danger of a reaction setting in which will injuriously affect outlying districts still unprovided with the means of education. In the early days of new agricultural settlements it is impossible to select the best sites for permanent Schools, the centres of population often shifting materially after the lapse of a very few years, and all experience points out the importance of adopting some plan which will meet urgent wants without long delays or unnecessary outlay. A series of simple lithographed plans of School-houses, with printed specifications capable of being modified according to the local circumstances of each district, and prepared under the direction of the Board's own officers, might be adopted with advantage for most of the schools which are likely to be required within the next few years, and would obviate the long delays which, owing to the continued pressure of business in the Department of Works, have hitherto been unavoidable. The question of the maintenance of buildings erected at the cost of the State requires to be separately considered. The accounts which I often receive from the officers who are charged with the occasional supervision of school-houses, showing that the principle of self-reliance, on the part both of the occupiers and of the district generally is being gradually extinguished, are not encouraging. There are honourable exceptions among the teachers; but it appears to be becoming a settled principle in many localities that if a nail has to be driven to fasten a loose board, a displaced shingle to be secured, a broken pane of glass to be mended, or any other item of petty repair to be executed, the matter must be left until it can be attended to by the Public Works Department.

The schools are, as a rule, fairly supplied with necessary furniture and apparatus. For many years past the desks in ordinary use have been constructed after a model originally designed for remote bush schools, to which there were no means of transport for bulky articles, and their inexpensiveness was suited to the limited funds at the disposal of the Board. Some improvement has been made in recent supplies, but no good model has yet come under my notice. Applications for expensive apparatus, and new and complete supplies of various articles of school equipment, are periodically received, which cannot be satisfactorily dealt with in the absence of a more definite rule than now exists in reference to free grants from the Department. While it will be admitted that it is highly desirable that teachers should have all reasonable assistance in their work, it is necessary, in dealing with public funds, to take into consideration the use to which the free stock has been applied in the past, or is likely to be applied in the future. Where, for instance, the children have not yet been properly instructed in the outlines of the map of the world or of the Australasian Colonies; where new and expensive charts are roughly thrown over the top of a common easel, or carelessly rolled up and left lying about in heaps; or where the whole stock bears evidence of habitual neglect, it is difficult to make out a claim to any special liberality on the part of the Board. Here, also, it would be well to have the principle of local responsibility recognised. The enforcement of a small local contribution towards the cost of all such school requisites as require careful handling to keep them in serviceable order would materially simplify a somewhat difficult question.

It is not easy to give any general statement as regards the sufficiency or the regularity of attendance in the Public Schools. In many districts, at certain times of the year, there is a constant demand for

children's labour, which is a necessary condition of their surroundings, though not always viewed in that light by zealous teachers, who chafe at these periodical impediments to the progress of their scholars. Where the attendance is scanty as compared with the population, or habitually irregular, it is an almost unfailing sign of some weakness in the school itself, and in such a case the compulsory clauses of the Act are of very little use. The School records are, as a rule, faithfully kept. Errors and omissions are often noticed which have occurred through ignorance or inexperience, and occasionally there are seen signs of habitual neglect of rules and instructions,—evidence which does not inspire an Inspector with much confidence as regards faithfulness in other duties over which he cannot exercise much direct supervision. The other defects under the head of school management are chiefly such as arise from too great latitude in rules, and from want of training in the practical business of a teacher. The age at which children may be admitted appears to require regulation. I have occasionally found children entered on the rolls of a school when little over two years of age, and though these are exceptional cases there are many children admitted who are too young for the ordinary routine of instruction, and either spend their time in idleness or take the attention of the teachers away from their proper duties. Speaking generally of the management of Schools, I may say that the number of those in which it may be described as ranging from satisfactory to very good is steadily on the increase.

The number of children individually examined during the last five months of the year in the various Schools for which I am directly responsible, was 2709. Of the condition of the Schools for destitute children subsidised by the State I have already furnished a Report. In the lower division of the First Class in the Public Schools I examined 462 children, whose attainments ranged from zero up to the acquisition of the first elements of reading and writing. The standard of qualification for the other classes is roughly defined by the programme of instruction, and in the upper division of the First Class I found 377 children; in the Second Class, 600; in the Third Class, 387; in the Fourth Class, 255; in the Fifth Class, 150; in the Sixth Class, 67. The failures in the Upper First Class amounted to 18·31 for every hundred examined; in the Second Class to 21·84 per cent.; in the Third Class to 16·80 per cent.; in the Fourth Class to 24·72 per cent.; in the Fifth Class to 42 per cent.; and in the Sixth Class to 17·92 per cent. The term "failure" implies that the individual scholar has either been prematurely placed in a particular class, or has retrograded since his last promotion. The exceptional cases which justify a teacher in departing from the strict letter of his instructions are so few in the aggregate that they would not appreciably affect the gross results. The degree of intelligence manifested by the children, the standard of excellence attained in special subjects or in particular schools, and the character of the teaching, are noted in my separate Reports; but the question of pass or failure in such results as I have quoted depends entirely upon the degree of proficiency shown in the elementary subjects of reading, writing, spelling, and arithmetic, and it will be readily seen that the standard of qualification in these essential branches must be, in some schools, very unsatisfactory. Of the general work in the higher branches of instruction I have nothing new to report. When it becomes possible to provide for greater uniformity in the interpretation of rules and standards it will be desirable to introduce a system of classification of schools. There are many schools which have well earned a right to have their good deserts placed on record, but it is not desirable, under existing conditions, to single out any of them for special mention in a public Report. It may also become practicable to institute a system of certificates of proficiency for the children attending Public Schools, which will serve both as incentives to improvement and as credentials for the information of employers, while they will also supply a want which is often felt by magistrates who have to decide questions arising under the compulsory clauses of the Act.

I may be excused for repeating that the chief weakness of our Educational system is the absence of the means of training eligible persons, of whom there are many in the Colony seeking suitable employment, in the business of school teaching and management. I am content, in the first instance, to ask only for a provision for enabling such persons to qualify themselves for teaching the simple rudiments of education. One good Normal or Model School would soon make its influence widely felt, at a very moderate cost, and the improvement in the schools would be the best argument that could be used in favour of an improvement in the position of the elementary teacher. Pending the settlement of the larger questions connected with educational reform, I trust that the moderate proposals for increasing the emoluments of teachers, which have received the unanimous approval of the Board of Education, will be promptly brought into operation, if only as an instalment of better things to come. The proposed augmentations of salary are small in amount, but they will afford substantial relief in a number of cases of real hardship, while, as no increase will be given without proof of merit in the recipient, they will be in harmony with the true principle of "payment for results," which has long been embodied in the existing system of classification under the Board, and which is not to be confounded with the system of capitation payments usually referred to under that term.

It will not be denied that almost every part of the Public School system might be considerably improved in points of detail: the principles on which it is founded are too valuable a possession to be lightly surrendered because defects in its operation are readily seen. My intimate relations with the schools of Tasmania for more than a quarter of a century enable me to speak with some confidence as to its general adaptation to the chief requirements of the people, and as to its freedom from defects which impair the efficiency of schemes of national education in some of the neighbouring colonies.

GENERAL Report for the Year 1883, by JAMES RULE, Esq., Inspector of Schools.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to submit to the Board of Education my General Report for the year 1883.

The same extent of districts was under my supervision in 1883 as in the latter half of 1882. The number of Schools open during the whole or part of the year was 75. The average number of scholars on the rolls in all these was 4397, and the average daily attendance, 3191. Five Schools were visited once only; thirty-nine, twice; fifteen, thrice; ten, four times; one was visited six times, and one nine times. The Schools that received only one visit were not open all the year; those closed in the latter half missing the regular examination. In addition to the inspection and examination of Schools, my year's work comprised several special journeys to districts requiring Schools, the incidental examinations of candidates for employment or promotion, preparation of reports, correspondence, participation (with the other Inspectors) in the regular examination of Teachers and candidates for the Board's Exhibitions, and the usual amount of travelling.

The number of Schools fully examined for results was 73, and the number of scholars, 3899.

It was found possible to trace the progress of 2152 of the scholars examined. Of these,—

13 per cent. had made good progress.
 18 per cent. had made fair progress.
 26 per cent. had made moderate progress.
 37 per cent. had made very slow progress.
 6 per cent. had made no appreciable progress.

Referring to the numbers examined and passed in the several classes, and to the standards actually reached by all, either passing or failing, I find that the work presented in 1883 compares unfavourably with that of the preceding year. A much larger percentage failed in Classes III., IV., V., and VI.; and the proportion that had in the three essential subjects reached or passed the standards of Class III. was only 11 per cent., while in 1882 it was 15 per cent. That this lower standard of results does not certainly indicate less industry on the part of the teachers is shown by a comparison, for the two years, of the proportion of scholars whose progress was moderately satisfactory or better, the difference being small,—that of 59 per cent. in 1882 and 57 per cent. in 1883. It may be here explained that a child's progress is termed good when in the three essential subjects a clear step from the standards of one class to those of the next higher is made in one year, and moderate when the same is done in two years.

The general work of the schools, the points in which they are satisfactory, their defects, and the amendments to the system of education that I consider advisable, have been fully treated in former reports; and, excepting the gratifying improvement in school buildings as regards comfort and convenience, which has been steadily progressing, I do not find that anything has occurred during the year to require special notice, or to make those reports inapplicable to the present condition of the schools generally.
