

ANNUAL REPORT of the Tasmanian Council of Education for the Year 1870-71.

To His Excellency Charles Du Cane, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and 22 Vict. No.21. Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Eleventh Report embracing the Section 30. proceedings of the Council between the 1st May, 1870, and the 30th April, 1871.

- 2. The Honorable F. M. Innes was elected President for the year ending 30th President. June, 1871.
- 3. We caused an Examination to be held in the month of June, 1870, of Candidates Exhibitions to Superior Schools. Twenty-four presented themselves for examination; Superior Schools and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the value of £20 each were awarded to Arthur Pitcairn Canaway and William Harvey Buckland, pupils of the Rev. J. R. Buckland, Hutchins School, Hobart Town.

Superior Schools, Gazette Notice, 28 June, 1870.

The Examiners in closing their Report observe: "Ten of the twenty-one boys, who had passed the preliminary Examination, reached the highest standard of 528 marks qualifying them for an Exhibition. The two foremost of these, Arthur P. Canaway and William H. Buckland, obtained 984 and 955 marks respectively. We have much pleasure in recommending them for Exhibitions, and certify that, in our opinion, they are highly deserving.

- "Besides the ten who reached the highest standard, four others obtained each more than 400 marks, a standard qualifying them for the mention of their names in the Table of Marks.
- "We remark with satisfaction that several boys, who have acquitted themselves so well at this Examination, have won distinction at former examinations, and that four of them have gained the Exhibitions awarded by the Board of Education; viz.—Canaway, Doran, Dobbie, and Richardson. The first named was at the head of the list of Exhibitioners in 1868, and has now achieved a like success under the test of an examination embracing a wider and more difficult range of subjects. Doran was then sixth on the same list with Canaway, and now holds the third place at the recent Examination. We are glad to know that he is still so young that he will be able to compete for an Exhibition next year."

4. The eleventh Examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in Degree of September, 1870; Professor Irving, M.A., being Examiner in all the subjects. Eight Associate of Candidates presented themselves. Six passed the preliminary Examination, and five Notice, 11 succeeded in obtaining the Degree, of whom four were placed in the First Class, and Oct. 1870. one in the Third Class. To the Senior Associate, James Wilkinson Whyte, in addition to the Council's Cold Model, were awarded the First Privated Reals of the value of £10. to the Council's Gold Medal, were awarded the First Prize of Books of the value of £10 for Latin, the First Prize of Books of the value of £5 for Natural Philosophy, and the Second Prize of Books of the value of £5 for French. To Ernest James Gatenby, placed in the First Class, was awarded the first Prize of Books of the value of £10 for Greek. The first Prize of Books of the value of £10 for French was awarded to William Denison Hull, who was placed in the First Class; and a second Prize of Books of the value of £5 for Greek to Edward Henry Robinson, who was also placed in the First Class.

The Examiner in closing his Report observes: "A comparison with former years gives the following result:—

"It will be seen from the foregoing Table that while the proportion of First Classes, four out of six Candidates, is far above the average, the standard of marks attained is below that which might be expected from a Class List containing only four firsts and one third. This indicates steady work rather than remarkable ability on the part of the Candidates. The marks of the Senior Associate are somewhat below the average; but it is only due to him to point out that this year, for the first time in the history of the Examination, not only a First Class, but the position of Senior Associate has been gained without Greek."

Standard of Marks for A.A. Degree.

On the recommendation of Professor Irving, we have raised the Standard of Marks for the First and Second Class in the Examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts. In future, with the exception of the ensuing Examination, the Standard of Marks will be, for the First Class 2350 instead of 2150, and for the Second Class 1900 instead of 1750. The standard for the Third Class remains unchanged, viz. 1350.

Tasmanian Scholarships, Gazette Notice, 11 October, 1870.

5. Professor Irving conducted the Examination for the Tasmanian Scholarships. Three Candidates presented themselves, but none succeeded in reaching the standard prescribed by the Council. This is the first time since 1861 that an Examination has taken place without an award of a Scholarship.

In his Report the Examiner states: "The marks obtained by the first and the second Candidate are higher respectively than those gained by Hope and Garrett in 1861, the only other year in which there has been a contest without an award.

"Like Hope and Garrett then the three Competitors now are, I understand, Associates of but one year's standing, and it is scarcely to be expected that such should achieve success, for the additional knowledge and the style of work demanded from a Candidate to be worthy of the Scholarship are more than any but a youth of extraordinary ability can hope to attain in the space of one year from the Degree of Associate of Arts."

Latin Verse Composition. 6. On the recommendation of the Examiner, Professor Irving, a Prize of Books of the value of £5 for Latin Verse Composition was awarded to John William Henry Geiss, A.A. 1869.

Gilchrist Scholarship. 7. Last year we reported that the Trustees of the Gilchrist Educational Trust conferred upon this Colony a biennial Scholarship of £100 per annum for three years at the University of Edinburgh, or University College, London, for the benefit of youths who have been resident in Tasmania for five years or over, and who are below the age of 22. We are gratified at being able to state that three Candidates have presented themselves for examination for the Gilchrist Scholarship. The first Examination will be held about September next.

January and the 31st December, 1870, the termination of the financial year; together statement with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1871. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1870 is shown to have amounted to £1271 6s. 8d., being £112 6s. 8d. less than the sum voted by Parliament.
