

# BOARD OF EDUCATION.

REPORT FOR 1871.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, June 25, 1872.



REPORT of the Board of Education for the Year 1871.

To His Excellency Charles Du Cane, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

- 1. We, the Members of the Board of Education, Tasmania, have the honor to submit the following Report of our proceedings during the past year.
- 2. During the year 1870, there were 128 Schools in actual operation. The total number of distinct children at any time on the Rolls for that year was 9997: the average number on the Rolls from month to month was 6678; the average daily attendance was 5041. During the year 1871 there were 130 Schools in operation; the total number of distinct children on the Rolls for the year was 10,194; the average number on the Rolls from month to month was 6786, and the average daily attendance 5187.

As compared with the year 1870 the number of Schools has increased by two; the total number of children on the Rolls by 197; the average number on the Rolls by 108; and the average daily attendance by 146.

3. Progress of Schools.—The progress of the Schools conducted in connection with the Board since the establishment of the present system of Public Instruction is shown in the following Table:—

The amount granted by the Board as shown above is chargeable against the Loans Bill, 31 Vict. No. 24. In addition to the sums expended or appropriated as above, we have paid £570 9s. 8d. out of the "Vote in aid of Public Schools" for repairs and improvements to Schoolhouses.

7. Schools at the following places were established during the year:—Castra Road, Peppermint Bay, Rosevale, Sassafras, and Wynyard; and four Schools were re-opened after having been temporarily closed; viz., Hadspen, Lachlan, Oyster Cove, and Taylor's Bay.

The Schools at Bracknell, Cradoc Hill, Huon Road, and Tunbridge were closed during the year.

8. Grant for Education.—The total expenditure out of the "Vote in aid of Public Schools"

amounted to £12,698 3s. 11d.. The appropriation of this money is exhibited in detail in Appendix A. and B., and may be briefly recapitulated as follows:—

13. Free Scholars.—We append a Return of the number of children admitted during the year under free certificates. The sum of £850 15s. 9d. has been paid by the Board for their instruction, the average number of Free Scholars under Instruction being 2013.50. See Appendix C.

14. Exhibitions from Public to Superior Schools.—In the month of June we caused an Examination for Exhibitions from Public to Superior Schools to be held; and 18 Candidates presented themselves; and on the recommendation of the Examiners, the Revs. Arthur Davenport and Francis Hudspeth, we awarded an Exhibition of the value of £16 13s. 4d. per annum, tenable for four years from the 1st July, 1871, to each of the under-mentioned Candidates:-

Arthur Anderson, age 12 years and 1 month, Public School, Elizabeth-street, Launceston.

George John Lindsay, age 11 years and 8 months, ditto.
Francis W. S. Allison, age 11 years and 10 months, ditto.
David Morgan, age 12 years and 4 months, Public School, Goulburn-street, Hobart Town. George Quinlan Roberts, age 11 years and 4 months, Public School, Battery Point, Hobart Town.

Stephen Henry Hughes, age 11 years and 6 months, Public School, New Town.

The Examiners in closing their Report, observe:-

"The results of the Examination are, in our opinion, very satisfactory, and reflect credit on the Teachers of the Public Schools,—on those especially whose pupils have so highly distinguished themselves. Twelve of the eighteen boys who competed for this distinction reached the standard qualifying them for an Exhibition; and, though six only will receive the substantial reward offered as a prize to the foremost, many who have been outstripped in the race have the satisfaction of knowing that they have acquitted themselves very creditably. The average of the marks obtained by the successful Candidates is 876,—less by 24 than it was last year, but very large as compared with the Examinations in many former years. The boys lowest in the list answered very fairly in some subjects."

The Exhibition gained by F. W. S. Allison was not taken up by him, and we awarded it to William Woodhead who stood next on the list of eligible Candidates.

A Statement of the expenditure under this head will be found in Appendix D.

15. Furneaux Group.—On our recommendation the Government appointed Mr. Henry Collis as a Teacher for the half-caste children on the Islands in Bass's Straits composing the Furneaux Group.

Mr. Collis commenced his duties on the 1st September, and opened School at Badger Island with an attendance of 11 children during September and October, and at Cape Barren Island in November with 14 Scholars.

#### APPENDIX E.

GENERAL Report for 1871, by T. Stephens, Esq., M.A., Chief Inspector of Schools.

Hobart Town, 11th May, 1872.

GENTLEMEN

I HAVE the honour to present the following brief Report on the work of inspection in the Southern Division of Tasmania during the past year.

There were in operation between, the 1st January and the 31st December sixty-six Public Schools, six of which were conducted on the half-time system, and the rest under separate Teachers, with a staff of assistants proportioned to the size and class of each School. The number of visits paid during the year to these Schools was one hundred and thirty-seven, and two entire rounds of inspection were completed. The formal Examination of the Schools under the standards prescribed by the Programme of Instruction was for the most part confined to the latter half of the year, and the essential points of the school work were sufficiently tested, though the Examination was sometimes curtailed through the pressure of multitudinous engagements. In many instances this work was supplementary to an Examination in the earlier part of the year, when the supervision of the ordinary routine of instruction was the principal object of the inspection. The examination of Teachers, of candidates for employment, and of Pupil Teachers, the miscellaneous office work, reports, and correspondence, and the other duties incidental to the office of Chief Inspector, gave full employment for all the time afforded by the intervals between my tours of inspection. Although carrying out to the fullest possible extent the plan of inspection which I proposed some five years ago, and which was adopted by the Board, I have gradually come to entertain doubts as to the expediency of applying one uniform system of visitation to a number of Schools all differing from each other in points of efficiency and demerit, and presenting several distinct grades, each of which demands special and appropriate treatment. For some Schools one annual visit of inspection is sufficient, but there are many which ought to be inspected three or four times a year if it be desired on the one hand to stimulate Teachers to raise their Schools to a reasonable standard of efficiency, or on the other hand to stimulate Teachers to raise their Schools to a reasonable standard of effi

Of the general character of instruction in Public Schools it is not possible to give any accurate statement where there is such a wide range from thorough efficiency down to a low standard, which is only tolerated because nothing better is attainable under existing circumstances. But the progress which is being made, if not so rapid as might be desired, is unmistakeably in the right direction. The Programme of instruction still appears to contain all that is necessary as an official guide to the Teachers of Public Schools. While it is available for the use of the humblest School, there is nothing in any of its provisions to check progress in an upward direction, so far as is consistent with the professed objects of elementary education, or to cramp the energies of an accomplished Teacher. That its directions are not faithfully carried out in all Schools must be admitted, and it will become necessary to enforce them with greater stringency, but so long as the departure from the prescribed course can be excused on the plea of ignorance or misconception; I am unwilling to recommend the Board to resort to severe measures. Of the subjects of instruction Reading is the one in which the greatest number of children satisfy the literal requirements of the Programme, and the smallest number reach a standard of real efficiency. Many Teachers have yet to learn that children are required not merely to know at sight the words of their reading books, and that the teaching has failed in one of its most important elements if they are unable to explain the meanings of the words which they use, or the incidental allusions which they meet with in their daily lessons. Distinctness of articulation and fluency will also be sedulously cultivated in a good School, and the skilled instructor will require no other medium for teaching spelling and the elements of grammar than the ordinary reading book of the class in connection, with dictation and blackboard exercises. Writing has greatly improved under all Teachers who have given their a

in the ordinary text-books. Scripture History is universally professed to be taught in the Schools, but few Teachers understand the proper management of the subject, and it is too often treated as an ordinary class reading lesson. The narratives of the Old and New Testament are admirably suited for collective teaching, and the lesson selected for the day should be only entrusted to the best readers, or read by the Teacher himself, while the attention of the children is secured by judicious questioning, and their interest excited by familiar and practical illustrations. And unless the Teacher deliberately goes out of the course indicated by Christian charity and common sense, there is no opportunity for the exhibition of sectarian bias, or for giving offence to the members of any particular denomination. English History is taken as an extra subject by the higher classes in a few of the Schools; but while the majority of children leave school before they have acquired a competent knowledge of the more essential branches, it is not desirable that much attention should be given to those which can only be studied by a very limited number. Drawing and Singing, as subjects of instruction, do not make any appreciable progress, though in one or two instances the teaching is skilful and well adapted to the Public School system. In some Schools there are extra subjects taught to a few scholars, though they are not included in the list sanctioned by the Board. I am always unwilling to interfere with the action of Teachers if there is no contravention of existing rules; but it seems probable that some limitation will have to be placed on the extension of the course of instruction, and it will perhaps be necessary to prohibit the introduction of extra subjects in all Schools which do not exhibit satisfactory evidence of the soundness of the elementary instruction in every class.

The result of the last general Examination of Teachers shows that the difficulty of obtaining a Certificate of Merit has been somewhat underrated by candidates for promotion. The scheme of classification was expressly designed to make the increase of salary contingent upon the exhibition of practical skill combined with theoretical knowledge, and the only defect that has hitherto become apparent is its tendency to give to the young Teachers who have but recently emerged from a state of pupilage an undue advantage over those who are unaccustomed to the routine of Examinations, though possessing those higher qualifications which are gained by experience alone. The tendency to encourage the practice of "cramming,"—the worst evil attendant on systems of competitive examination,—I have endeavoured to check by declining to name or use special text-books for the subjects of the prescribed course.

The establishment of Local Boards in some localities has had a decidedly beneficial influence in developing a more general interest in the Schools; in others everything has been left to the one person who formerly acted as Special Visitor; and in a few cases difficulties have arisen which had no previous existence. Valuable aid might be rendered by the Members of Local Boards if they would undertake to see that the rules and instructions of the Central Board are faithfully carried out in every School, but this would often be a troublesome and unpleasant duty, and its strict performance could hardly be expected from those who hold an honorary and irresponsible office. I hope, however, to induce some of the Local Boards to see to the observance of one important rule which requires the Teacher to test the progress of his classes at stated times, twice a year or oftener. The presence and co-operation of Members of Local Boards on such occasions might be exceedingly useful.

The refusal of the Board of Education to sanction the authoritative examination of Public Schools by any other than the officer who is responsible for testing the character of the instruction by fixed and definite standards would not require any comment but for 'the misunderstanding that is occasionally found to prevail in reference to the question of Examinations. Among the Members of Local Boards there are many of high education and intelligence, who are thoroughly qualified to decide any abstract question connected with the education imparted by a School; but if all were equally competent the objections would not be removed, and the chief of these is that a Teacher cannot be made responsible to more than one authority for the mode of conducting his School without a deliberate abandonment of the system of public instruction. The Inspector is bound by certain definite standards, and by a certain interpretation of those standards which he explains for the Teacher's guidance. The Members of Local Boards could not be limited in the same way, and Teachers who should see their Schools examined at different times upon different principles might well despair of giving satisfaction to either Examiner. At the same time it may be safely said that all Teachers are glad to have the advice and assistance of educated persons, and that there are ample opportunities for ascertaining the character of the instruction in a Public School without the formality of a regular Examination.

The weak points in our system have been noticed in previous reports. The chief defects are the absence of any adequate provision for the training of Teachers; the want of local responsibility for that portion of the expenses of school maintenance and repairs which is required to meet the grants from the funds of the Board; and the want of a sufficient check to ensure the best possible results for the expenditure of public money. With all these disadvantages it cannot but be gratifying to all who knew anything of the state of things ten or fifteen years ago to see the progress which has been made in the extension of the means of Education.
