

NINTH ANNUAL REPORT of the Inspector of the Constabulary Force of the Municipalities of Tasmania, for the Year ending 30th June, 1866. (Pursuant to 29 Vict. No. 9.)

Office of Inspector of Police, 26th July, 1866.

In submitting for the information of His Excellency the Governor my Ninth Annual Report on the state of the different Municipal Police Forces in the Colony, I have the honor to inform you that they have all been efficiently maintained during the past year,—their efficiency varying, however, according to the liberality of, and the support given to them by, the several Municipal Councils under whose control they are maintained. I invariably find that the greater their strength and efficiency the more popular they are, affording as they do greater security to the public, and a due return to the ratepayer for the money expended. Generally speaking, I am gratified to observe a clearly manifested disposition on the part of the local authorities to maintain an efficient Police organisation, though in some of the Municipalities the Forces are only just sufficiently strong to pass the test of efficiency.

Crime of a serious character is gradually on the decrease, and few reports of the "drifting" of sheep from outlying flocks have recently been made by stockholders. Indictable offences of the usual kind have slightly increased, and consequent thereon the number of persons apprehended and prosecuted to conviction has been greater. Though the offences of malicious firing of grain, stacks, and barns, &c. is still rather prevalent, its commission is less frequent. This is a crime which it is most difficult to cope with, and, indeed, impossible to prevent by the employment of any conceivable number of Constables within reasonable limits, and its prevalence should not detract from the general character for efficiency of the Police.

One additional Rural Municipality only (Evandale) has been established since my last Report, in which a Police Force has been organised on a liberal scale.

The abolition of the Superannuation Fund—the retention of which I advocated as holding out one of the strongest inducements to experienced and intelligent men to remain in the service, and which in the Mother-country the Inspectors urge on the Government to secure by Legislative enactment—has had a prejudicial effect on the minds of the Constabulary, depriving them, as they consider it does, of that certainty of compensation and reward for good service its existence legally secured to them.

In conclusion, I may remark that the authorities continue to treat any suggestions I may be called upon to offer on my visits of inspection with due consideration.

Annexed I furnish a Return showing the authorised strength and pay of all the Municipal Police Forces.

There has been no alteration in the numerical strength nor organisation of this Force since my last Report, and its efficiency has been satisfactorily maintained. When inspected it was complete, and composed of active, healthy-looking men, well clothed and supplied with the usual necessaries, accourrements, &c., all in good condition. Two men had been promoted to the Merit Class. Two Petty Constables had also resigned since last inspection; and on examining the Defaulters' Book, I found no Constable had during the year been subjected to punishment or reprimand,—a proof of extremely good conduct on the part of the men if too great leniency has not been shown by the Superintendent.

The Lodging-houses are visited by an Acting Sub-Inspector; and the Slaughtering-houses are specially protected by a Petty Constable, who is not, however, borne on the effective strength.

During the year ending 30th June, 372 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 255 persons were apprehended, of whom 186 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Of the 149 Public-houses within the Municipality, 13 had been proceeded against, and in 11 cases penalties inflicted. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 258, of whom 127 were males, and 131 females. The Station-house, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair, and the Books, Records, and Returns well and correctly kept. A Medical Officer visits the Station-house.

TOWN OF LAUNCESTON,

This Force remains unchanged in numbers and organisation since my last inspection. Though the recommendation I submitted last year—that it should be augmented by one Petty Constable—has not been adopted, it yet comes up to the standard of efficiency, though I still think protection is required in the locality I then alluded to. There have been neither resignations nor dismissals from the Force beyond the retirement of the Superintendent, who had had charge of it since its first establishment, but whose inefficiency had of late become very apparent. The Petty Constables are now all promoted to the First Class, and their permanency of service is highly satisfactory. On inspection the men looked remarkably well, and their uniform which had been in wear nearly twelve months, together with their accountements, &c., were in very good order.

During the year ending 30th June, 137 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 72 persons had been apprehended, of whom 54 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Out of the 54 Public-houses within the Municipality two had been proceeded against. 281 persons had been charged with being drunk and disorderly, of whom 148 were males and 133 females. The Station-house, Barracks, and Cells were clean, though the latter still afford inadequate accommodation for the confinement of prisoners, and the Books, Records, and Returns were well and correctly kept. A Medical Officer visits the Station-house.

RURAL MUNICIPALITIES.

The authorised numerical strength of this Force, which is efficient, remains unaltered, though at my inspection I found three vacancies for Special Constables had remained a long time open: these I suggested should at once be filled up. No men had resigned nor been dismissed from the effective force. The Constables were still without Uniform,—a defect I again brought under the notice of the Authorities.

During the year ending 30th June 27 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 17 persons had been apprehended, of whom 10 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Proceedings had been taken against one Public-house, and 12 persons had been charged with drunkenness

and disorderly conduct, 10 of whom were males and 2 females. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair, and the Books, Records, and Returns correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

SPRING BAY.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength or organisation since my last Report, and is yet efficient, though the area of the Municipality has been increased by the annexation of a portion of Sorell, which will necessitate the establishment of an Escort Station on its boundary towards Richmond. The substitution of a Special for a Permanent effective Constable at the White Hut—which the Council had submitted could be done without affecting the efficiency of the Force—I could not accede to. There had been neither resignations nor dismissals since my inspection. The wall that was required to ensure the security of the station has been erected.

During the year ending 30th June 18 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 9 persons were apprehended, all of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against Public-houses. 8 persons—6 males and 2 females—had been proceeded against for drunkenness and disorderly conduct. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells I found clean and in good repair, and the Books, Records, and Returns correctly kept. The undress Uniform worn by the men was of good quality, and their Arms and Accountrements in good order. No Medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

CLARENCE.

This Force is efficient, and remains unaltered in numerical strength or organisation. One Special Constable was deficient at the time of my inspection, but there had been no dismissals nor resignations from its effective strength.

During the year ending 30th June 18 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 9 persons had been apprehended, all of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 4 persons, of whom 2 were males and 2 females, had been proceeded against for drunkenness and disorderly conduct. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; the Books, Records, and Returns correctly kept; and the Clothing, Arms, and Accoutrements of the men in good order. No Medical Man attends the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Roads.

RICHMOND.

The area of this Municipality has been increased since my last Report, by having a portion of Oatlands annexed to it. This does not, however, involve any augmentation of its Police Force, which is efficient, and remains unaltered in numerical strength or organisation. On my inspection I found the Force in charge of the Serjeant, the Superintendent having met with a serious accident. The men were supplied with clothing of good quality, and their Arms and Accourtements were in good order.

During the year ending the 30th June no dismissals nor resignations had taken place. 37 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 29 persons had been apprehended, of whom 13 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No proceedings had been taken against public-houses. 16 persons, 10 males and 6 females, had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct. The Station-houses, with the exception of that at Jerusalem, which was to undergo some repairs, the Wards and Cells were clean and orderly; and the Books, Records, and Returns were correctly kept. A Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

Since my last Report the area of this Municipality has been considerably diminished by portions of it being annexed to Richmond and Green Ponds. A corresponding reduction of 2 Petty Constables has been made, leaving the Force, however, still efficient. The Station at Rumney Huts had been finished, and occupied by a Petty Constable. One Petty Constable resigned during the year ending 30th June; and within a corresponding period 78 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 41 persons had been apprehended, of whom 35 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. An information had been laid against one public-house. 24 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 12 were males and 12 females. The men looked well, and their Clothing, Arms, and Accoutrements were in good order. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. No Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock, and the Constable stationed at Tunbridge is Pound-keeper there.

The numerical strength and organisation of this Force, which fully maintains its efficiency, remains unaltered. The men were well clothed, looked well, and had their Arms and Accoutrements in good order.

During the year ending 30th June 1 Petty Constable had resigned, and 1 had been dismissed. 47 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 25 persons had been apprehended, of whom 20 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 139 persons had been charged with being drunk and disorderly, 99 of whom were males and 40 females. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Records, and Returns correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

GREEN PONDS.

An augmentation of two Petty Constables has been made to this Force since my last Report, consequent on the extension of the area of the Municipality by the annexation of portions of Oatlands, Bothwell, and Hamilton. The Escort Stations at Melton Mowbray and Spring Hill are now occupied by the Force, which is efficient. Increased accommodation at the Head Station-house has been afforded by the addition of a small ward; but additional buildings, particularly for the holding of the Local Courts, are desirable.

During the year ending 30th June there had been neither dismissals nor resignations from the Force. 29 indictable offences have been reported to the Police, for which 20 persons had been apprehended, of whom 12 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 64 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 43 were males and 21 females. The clothing of the men, as well as their Arms and Accourtements, were in good order. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

SORELL.

The numerical strength and organisation of this Force, which is efficient, has not been altered since my last Report, though the area of the Municipality has been diminished by a portion of it being annexed to Spring Bay. Its distribution, however, at my suggestion, has been slightly changed, an out-station having been established at a point a few miles from Sorell, which wanted protection, acts of malicious injury to property having been of frequent occurrence. The discipline enforced by the Superintendent seemed of too lax a character, and a corresponding want of smartness about the men and attention to their clothing was apparent.

During the year ending the 30th June no dismissals nor resignations had taken place. 47 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 36 persons had been apprehended, of whom 21 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No public-houses had been proceeded against. 21 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, 13 of whom were

males and 8 females. The head Station-house required repairs, and the yard was untidy and dirty. The Wards and Cells were clean and orderly, and the Arms and Accountrements were in good order. No Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

BOTHWELL.

The area of this Municipality has been decreased since my last Report by the annexation of a portion of it to Green Ponds. The numerical strength and organisation of its Force has not, however, been altered; and though I am able to pronounce it efficient, yet the stationing of an additional Constable in a locality from which Police protection has been withdrawn by the change in boundaries would be desirable.

During the year ending the 30th of June no man had left the Force, either by dismissal or resignation. 22 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 21 persons had been apprehended, of whom 14 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 33 persons had been charged with being drunk and disorderly, of whom 22 were males and 11 females. The men were well clothed, and their Arms and Accoutrements in good order. The Station-house, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Station. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

This Force, which is efficient, remains unaltered in numerical strength or organisation since my last Report. The men were well supplied with clothing, and their Arms and Accourtements were in good order.

During the year ending 30th June there were neither dismissals nor resignations from the Force. 22 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 19 persons had been apprehended, of whom 11 were convicted summarily or committed for trial, Informations had been laid against 2 Publichouses. 10 persons, of whom 6 were males and 4 females, had been charged with being drunk and disorderly. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

NEW NORFOLK.

This Force is efficient, and has undergone no alterations, either in numerical strength or organisation, since my last Report. The men were well clothed, and their Arms and Accoutrements were in good order. No dismissals nor resignations had taken place since my last inspection.

During the year ending the 30th June 95 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 69 persons had been apprehended, of whom 54 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Informations had been heard against 2 Public-houses. 55 persons, of whom 34 were males and 21 females, had been convicted of drunkenness and disorderly conduct. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records were correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Station. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

HAMILTON.

The area of this Municipality has been slightly diminished by the annexation of a small portion of it to Green Ponds; but this has necessitated no change in the numerical strength or organisation of its Force, which remains unaltered since my last inspection, and is efficient. A new Station-house, much required, is in course of erection at the Ouse Bridge.

During the year ending 30th June 1 Sub-Inspector and 1 Petty Constable had been dismissed from the Force. 25 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 19 persons had been apprehended, all of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been heard against Public-houses. 40 persons had been proceeded against for drunkenness and disorderly conduct, 25 of whom were males and 15 females. The men required new clothing, and two of the Petty Constables were not supplied with unitorm. Their Arms and Accourtements were in good order. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. A Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

BRIGHTON.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength or organisation since my last Report: it is efficient. An Out-station has been established at Bridgewater. Want of permanency of service is apparent,—one Petty Constable having been dismissed and two having resigned since my last inspection. The appointment of a man to the Force who had been twice removed from the Territorial Force and once from a Municipal one, and was otherwise of exceptional character, drew from me a strong remonstrance against the want of care exercised by the Authorities in the selection of Constables.

During the year ending the 30th June 30 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 17 persons had been apprehended, of whom 11 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. One Public-house had been proceeded against. 89 persons, 64 of whom were males and 25 females, had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct. The Station-house, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; the Clothing, Arms, and Accoutrements of the men were in excellent order; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. No Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

WESTBURY.

No change has taken place in the numerical strength or organisation of this Force, which satisfactorily maintains its efficiency. This has been further increased since my last Report by an allowance for forage to every Out-station Constable. A new Station is in course of erection at Exton. The men looked well, were well clothed, and their Arms and Accourtements were in excellent order.

There had been no dismissals nor resignations from the Force since my last inspection. During the year ending 30th June 64 offences had been reported to the Police, for which 45 persons had been apprehended, of whom 30 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been heard against Public-houses. 152 persons had been proceeded against for drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 129 were males and 23 females. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. A Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

DELORAINE.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength or organisation since my last Report: it is an efficient one. A new Station-house was in course of erection at Elizabeth Town, which will facilitate the escort of Prisoners from the North Coast. One Constable had resigned, and one had been dismissed since my last inspection.

During the year ending 30th June last 57 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 40 persons had been apprehended, of whom 30 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 147 persons, of whom 102 were males and 45 females, had been charged with being drunk and disorderly. The men were well clothed, and their Arms and Accoutrements were in good order. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Records, and Returns were correctly kept. No Medical Officer attends the Station. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

No alteration has occurred in the numerical strength or organisation of this Force since my last Report: it is efficient. The Municipality does not yet feel itself in a position financially to authorise the erection of new, or additions to the existing, buildings. The limited accommodation afforded by the Station-house has, however, been improved.

During the year ending 30th June no dismissals or resignations from the Force had taken place. 20 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 14 persons had been apprehended, of whom 11 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No public-houses had been proceeded against. 24 persons had been charged with drunken and disorderly conduct, of whom 14 were males and 10 females. The men looked well, were well clothed, and their Arms and Accountrements were in good order. The Station-house, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Returns, and Records correctly kept. No Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

This Municipality was established on the 30th December, 1865, and its Police Force was organised on an efficient scale. It consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 5 Petty Constables, and 1 Special Constable.

There are 3 Out-stations,—Lymington, Upper Nile, and Snake Banks, and the erection of another at the White Hills is under consideration. The men were well clothed and accounted, and their Arms were in good order.

During the half year ending 30th June no men had left the Force, either by dismissal or resignation. 19 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 16 persons had been apprehended, of whom 10 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 15 persons had been charged with being drunk and disorderly, 11 of whom were males and 4 females. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Records, and Returns correctly kept. No Medical Officer attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Stock.

FINGAL.

This Force is an efficient one, and its numerical strength and organisation remains unaltered since my last Report. I found it in charge of a Sub-Inspector, the Superintendent being absent on sick leave. The Superintendent has been granted an additional forage allowance of £25 a year. A new Station, with Lock-up, was about to be erected on the Township of Mangana, and additional buildings were in progress at the Station at St. Mary's Pass. The men were well clothed, and their Arms and Accountrements were in good order.

During the year ending 30th June, one Petty Constable had been dismissed from the Force, but there were no resignations. 31 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 28 persons had been apprehended, of whom 21 were convicted summarily or committed for trial. No informations had been heard against public-houses. 53 persons, of whom 33 were males and 20 females, had been charged with being drunk and disorderly. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were clean and in good repair; and the Books, Records, and Returns correctly kept. No Medical man attends the Station-house. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.
