



## AID TO ROADS.

PETITION FROM WEST TAMAR ROAD DISTRICT.

Presented by Mr. Sherwin, 22 August, 1865, and ordered by the House to be printed.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the Trustees of the West Tamar Road District.

## RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That your Petitioners have been made aware of the intention to ask your Honorable House to assent to a measure which will have the effect of diverting from its purpose the fund created under provisions of the 86th Section of 27 Victoria, No. 22, to other purposes.

That the heavy assessment upon the West Tamar Road District, consequent upon the expenditure of a large sum of money in constructing a Bridge over the South Esk River, in addition to the usual Road Rates will render the imposition of any further rate most oppressive.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray your Honorable House to withhold its assent from any measure having for its object the diversion of this fund from its proper application as directed by the 87th Section of the Statute above quoted.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
