

ESTABLISHMENT AT PORT ARTHUR.

REPORT FOR 1875.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Secretary, and ordered by the House to be printed, September 12, 1876.



Civil Commandant's Office, Port Arthur, 12th April, 1876.

Sir,

I HAVE the honor to furnish the Annual Report of this Establishment for 1875.

The following Returns from A. to H. supply in detail every information under their respective headings.

They show—1. The value of articles supplied to credit at £468 17s. 9d. 2. The number and nature of cases of misconduct tried at 19. 3. The number of prisoners at commencement of year at 135, and at termination at 86. 4. The various descriptions of employment. 5. The amount of produce raised at £866 9s. 2d. 6. The firewood and timber supplied at £636 15s. 8d. 7. The repairs to buildings, washing, &c. at £373 3s. 5d. The average number of effective prisoners at 83; paupers and invalids under detention at 32; and lunatics at 87; with death of one prisoner, four paupers, and two lunatics.

Foremost in the list of offences stands one of felonious assault, and for which the extreme penalty of the law was allowed to take its course. The offender at the time of perpetrating the crime was undergoing a sentence of 8 years' imprisonment, and was generally so well conducted that for 2 years previously he had been variously employed at the Settlement as a "billeted man," and was therefore not under such strict surveillance as the other prisoners.

Another occurrence of a distressing nature has also to be recorded, namely, the loss and consequent perishing of a lunatic in the bush. The unfortunate man was one of the gang usually employed in procuring firewood for the Insane Department; and, whilst so engaged, appears to have got out of sight of the warders in charge, and, despite the subsequent searches made, could not be traced, nor consequently recovered.

The death of the second lunatic was caused by paralysis at the age of 73; whilst the mortality of the paupers was, respectively, from old age, paralysis, kidney affection, and liver disease. The prisoner succumbed to pulmonary consumption; and, excepting always the afore-mentioned cases, there cannot be said to have been any serious sickness amongst the inmates of the several Departments of the Establishment.

The expenditure is elaborately set forth in Tables Nos. 1 and 2, and shows the cost per head of prisoners at £31 19s. 4d.; of pauper Hospital patients at £24 3s. 4d.; and of lunatics at £29 13s. 4d.

These different amounts are much in excess of those of the preceding year, owing as a sequence to a reduction in numbers, and the impracticability of effecting a pro rata diminution in the general outlay: a fact that becomes the more noticeable the nearer an approach is made to a final abandonment of the Peninsula.

As evidence in support of this statement, and continuing the comparison of 1874 and 1875, it will be seen that, although the total expenditure for the former year exceeded by upwards of £1500 that of the latter, yet the cost per head for prisoners was £11 12s. 4d.; for Hospital patients, £2 4s. 11d.; and for lunatics, 18s. 9d. more in 1875 than in 1874.

It is not necessary to follow the subject farther; and therefore, in concluding, it only remains for me to record my appreciation of the satisfactory manner in which the duties of the Establishment were carried out, and of the cheerful obedience in matters of discipline always accorded to me by the individual members of the staff under my control.
