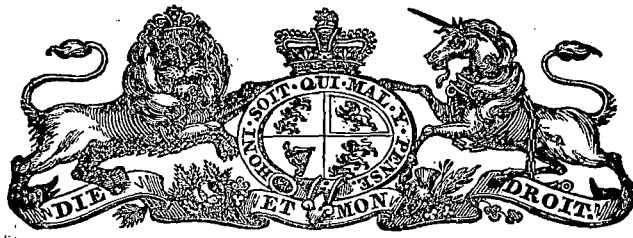

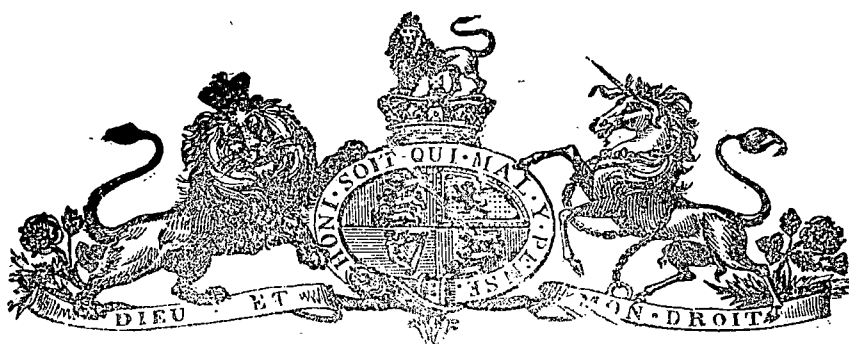

ANNUAL REPORT for 1875.

I HAVE the honor to lay before the Government the Annual Report for the year ending 31st December, 1875.

The number of cases treated in Hospital during the year was slightly in excess of those treated in the previous year, and the mortality was six less; of the deaths more than half occurred in patients upwards of 50 years of age.

Amongst the admissions were several cases of diphtheria, the greater number of whom were received from the country districts.

The number of paying patients was 40 less than in 1874. The diminution is accounted for by the decrease in the number of patients received from the Main Line Railway works, and the discontinuance of the subscription from the Contractors at the latter part of the year.

The number of out-patients treated at the Dispensary was very much larger than in 1874, and a great many pauper patients who were unable to attend at the Hospital were visited at their own homes.

STATISTICAL Report of the Surgeon Superintendent.

DURING the past year there were admitted into Hospital 1024 patients, of whom 669 were males and 355 females.

There were remaining under treatment at the commencement of the year, 63; so that the total number treated during the year ending 31st December, 1875, was 1087. Of these, 908 were discharged, 104 died, and 75 remain under treatment.

Seven persons died on the day of admission, 9 on the day after, 5 on the second day, 4 on the third, 4 on the fourth, 3 on the fifth, and 2 on the sixth day.

Of the patients admitted 99 were self-supporting, 27 were either wholly or in part chargeable to Imperial funds, and 961 were Colonial paupers.

The number of out-patients treated during the year was 6668; the number of prescriptions was 9389.
