



## PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

## FORTH ROAD TRUST:

PETITION FROM P. CALLAGHAN, J.P.

Presented by Mr. Dooley, August 20, 1890, and ordered by the House of Assembly to be printed, August 22, 1890.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned,

## RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

- 1. That on the 19th September, 1889, sanction was given to the correspondence between the Auditor-General and your Petitioner re "Forth Road Trust" Accounts being placed on the Table of your Honorable House.
  - 2. That on the 31st October, 1889, said correspondence was tabled.
- 3. That as this correspondence contains serious imputations against Trustees of the Forth Road Trust (past and present), which the Auditor-General declined to investigate, stating that "there was no evidence," notwithstanding that the vouchers as well as the year to which they appertained was duly pointed out, therefore, your Petitioner most respectfully begs that the subject be investigated and dealt with in such manner as your Honorable House may think fit: for which, as in duty bound, your Petitioner shall for ever pray.
