

## TASMANIAN PUBLIC LIBRARY.

# REPORT.

- 1. The Trustees, in presenting their Tenth Annual Report, have pleasure in announcing that during the past twelve months 25,721 visits have been recorded in the Visitors' Book.
- 2. In their last Report the Trustees were able to state that provision had been made by the City Council for cleaning and decorating the walls of the Reading Room and Library. This work has since been carried out, and the Trustees have the satisfaction of being able to report a very great improvement in the appearance of the rooms of the Institution.
- 3. The Institution is still kept open to the public on all public holidays and during the afternoons of Sunday, Good Friday, and Christmas Day, with satisfactory results.
- 4. The Trustees have to acknowledge with thanks presentations received from His Excellency Sir J. H. Lefroy, Sir Charles Du Cane, the late Sir Redmond Barry, and from kindred Institutions in England, Ireland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, New Zealand, Tasmania, and the Governments of the various Colonies.
- 5. An English Artist (R. P. Noble, Esq.) having forwarded to the Hon. J. W. Agnew, M.L.C., a water-color painting, valued at £25, for presentation to one of the Public Institutions in Tasmania, that gentleman handed over the picture to the Public Library; and the Trustees express a hope that this presentation may lead to the formation of a small Art Gallery in connection with the Institution.
  - 6. During the year 182 volumes have been added by purchase and presentation.

9. The Books, Furniture, and Fittings belonging to the Public Library are insured in the Cornwall Insurance Company for £2000.

Memorandum.—The invested funds amount to One thousand five hundred Pounds placed in the Commercial Bank, and bearing interest at the rate of Three per cent. The revenue so derived will be paid over by the Trustees to the Municipal Council of Hobart in aid of the salary of the Librarian. (It has been usual for the Trustees to invest the funds in Government Securities; but none being available when last applied for, the Trustees deemed it advisable to deposit the funds in the Commercial Bank until a favourable opportunity for investment should offer).\*
