

5.	Perkins, Henry Alleine	1866	16 6	18 6	Edinburgh.	In 1867 passed the Matriculation Examination of the London University with Honours. In 1869 passed First Professional Examination, in Edinburgh, gaining Honoursin the Natural Sciences. In 1870 gained First Class Honours in Pathology and Materia Medica in the Voluntary Class Examinations, and afterwards passed his Second Professional Examination. In 1871 further obtained a Prize for Vivà Voce Examination in Midwifery; and obtained the Degrees of Licentiate in Midwifery, Bachelor of Medicine, and Master in Surgery. After a competitive Examination, was appointed Resident Physician to the University Clinical Wards of the Royal Infirmary. In 1874, having composed a thesis, proceeded to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine.
