

BOARD OF IMMIGRATION.

REPORT FOR 1873.

Laid upon the Table by the Attorney-General, and ordered by the House to be printed, August 20, 1874.

SIR.

THE Board of Immigration have the honor to present their Report on Immigration for the year ending 31st December, 1873.

The Immigration under the Bounty System from the United Kingdom was slightly in excess of that during the year 1872, and included several Operatives introduced for the purpose of carrying on a Woollen Manufactory.

The Immigrants consisted of two married couples and one woman whose husband came out subsequently paying his own passage, nine single males, two single females, and twelve children, at a total cost to the Board of one hundred and eighty-five pounds.

Land Certificates under the 7th Section of the Act of Parliament, 31 Viet. No. 26, have been issued to fifteen applicants, entitling the holders to select in all one thousand and thirty acres of the Waste Lands of the Crown.

These Certificates represent thirteen male and twelve female adults, and thirty-eight children, or a total of sixty-three souls.

Land Orders under the 5th Section of the same Act have been issued to two applicants, authorising the selection of one hundred and thirty-five acres, and representing two male and three female adults, and five children, in all ten souls.

On the 6th March the ship "Clairellen" arrived with one hundred and fifty-two adult males, twenty-one adult females, and fourteen children; and on the 20th June the "Caranjah" brought two hundred and forty-three adult males, forty-nine adult females, and fifty-one children.

These vessels were chartered by the Contractors for the Main Line Railway, and brought out emigrants in whose favour, by special arrangement with the Board, Land Order Warrants were issued in London.

As these immigrants were under engagement with the Contractors for a period of not less than two years, and as the Contractors paid their passage money to the Colony, these Land Order Warrants are held by them until the fulfilment of the terms of the engagements.

No application has therefore yet been made by any of these immigrants for their Land Orders.

The balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December last amounted to £6899 14s. 11d.

Appended are the usual Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent,—five referring to the operations of the Board under the Bounty System, and two relating to transactions under the Act of Parliament, 31 Vict. No. 26.

A statement is also annexed showing the number of selections under the 5th and 7th Sections of the 31 Vict. No. 26, the amount of land selected by virtue of their Land Certificates and Land Orders, and the additional area purchased by the same selectors under the usual provisions of the Waste Lands Act.

MEMORANDUM shewing the Financial Aspect of Operations under "The Immigration Act, 1867," 31 Vict. No. 26, up to 31st December, 1873.

2611 acres of land have been selected under the Act 31 Vict. No. 26.

The Customs Revenue for 1873 amounted to £167,995 12s, 8d.

The population on the 31st December, 1873, is given at 104,217.

The average annual contribution to Customs is therefore £1 12s. $2\frac{3}{4}d$, per head, or £254 12s. $2\frac{1}{2}d$, from the 158 individuals abovementioned. Valuing the land selected at £1 per acre, or £2611, the Government are receiving interest thereon through the Customs duties paid by the selectors and their families at the rate of £9.75 per cent. per annum.
