

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT FOR YEAR 1895.

Police Department, Commissioner's Office, Hobart, 9th June, 1896.

Sir,

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Territorial Police for the year 1895.

Five Constables resigned during the year, and two died.

The reductions during the year were two Superintendents, one Sub-Inspector, and sixteen Constables. The offices of Superintendent in the Districts of George Town and South Longford, and of Sub-Inspector at St. Leonard's, were abolished, and the following Police Stations were closed:—Mount Stuart, Fern Tree, Gordon, Leslie, Branxholm, Boobyalla, Weldborough, Piper's River, Don, Sassafras, and Cam; some of these reductions, effected at the beginning of the year, were referred to in my last Report.

The Inspecting Superintendent, who is also Superintendent in charge of the Districts of New Town, Queenborough, Kingston, and Carnarvon, and of the Towns of Bellerive and Beltana, entered upon his new duties on 1st January. He visited during the year all the Territorial Police Stations in the Colony, except those of the Macquarie District, West Coast. I append his Report. I visited during the year the Districts of Selby and George Town, and since the close of the year, the District of Macquarie.

The increase of population in the District of Macquarie, and the rapid expansion of the mining industry in that part of the Colony, rendered necessary the establishment of stations at Queenstown, with one Constable, and Teepookana, King River, with two Constables; and since the close of the year an additional Constable has been stationed at Strahan. A reduction of one Constable was effected at Zeehan. During my visit to the District in February last I personally enquired into the probability of a demand for further police protection at the principal centres of mining activity, and the places where prospecting operations are being conducted. It is extremely probable an addition to the number of Constables will be called for shortly.

It affords me much pleasure to testify to the assiduous and efficient manner in which the Officers of the Clerical Branch at Head Quarters performed their duty, as well as to the zeal and activity displayed by the several Officers and Constables generally throughout the Districts. The additional work and increased responsibility, consequent upon the extensive reductions in the Department, were cheerfully undertaken.

The amount to the credit of the Territorial Police Provident Fund on 31st December, 1895, was:—Superannuation Branch, £5726 6s. 5d.; Reward Branch, £1224 6s. 5d. The retiring allowances paid during the year amounted to £1132 8s. 3d., and the amount of Rewards given was £318 10s.

I append the usual Return, showing the strength and distribution of the Police during the year. I also attach the usual tabulated comparative Return of Offences reported in the Territorial Police Districts, which shows a considerable decrease of offences of every description. The decrease in the number of persons charged with drunkenness is remarkable.

SIR.

I have the honor to report for your information that during the year 1895 I visited, as Inspecting Superintendent of Police, all the Police Stations in each District in Tasmania (with the exception of the Macquarie District) once each, and some Stations, as circumstances permitted, on several occasions, and I am pleased to say that, after a strict examination of the books, buildings, clothing of the Police, and other matters pertaining to the efficiency of a well organised Force, I have little or no complaint to make. The officers and constables, from close observation, led me to believe that they are a sober, intelligent, and well conducted body of men.

The records of crime, as shown by the books, have considerably diminished, notwithstanding the general depression throughout the Colony, which is not only creditable to the Police, but also to the population at large.
