

PETITION AGAINST WITHDRAWAL OF THE CHARGE OF ROADS FROM THE COUNCIL.

Presented by Mr. Whyte, September 21; and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 22, 1865.



To the Honorable the President and Members of the Legislative Council in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the Warden and Councillors of the Municipality of Glamorgan.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

THAT your Petitioners have viewed with feelings of disappointment and alarm the proposed withdrawal from Municipal Councils of the charge of Roads, in the Draft Municipal Bill, as lately altered in the Honorable the House of Assembly.

Your Petitioners would point out that the provisions with regard to Roads in the present Municipal Law have always worked well in the Glamorgan Municipality; that it is quite impossible that two bodies can work harmoniously together therein; and that the care of the Roads forms the principal business at all Council Meetings. Your Petitioners believe that the adoption of the alteration referred to would prove very injurious to the interests of Municipalities generally, and would cause much inconvenience and extra expense.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that the present Law with regard to control over Roads in Municipal Districts be not allowed.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.
