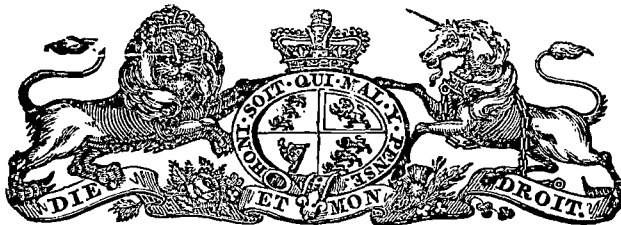

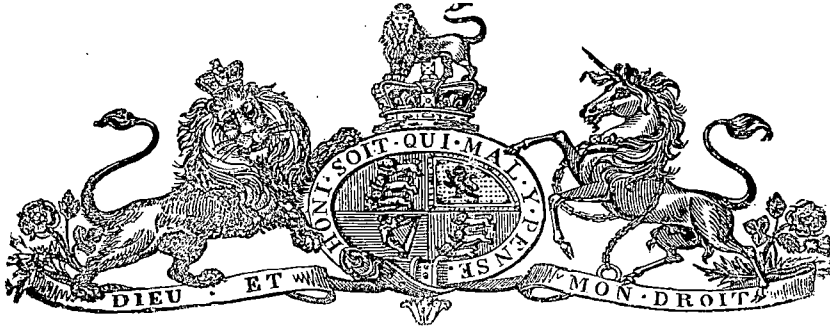

ANNUAL REPORT of the TASMANIAN COUNCIL OF EDUCATION for the Year 1880-81.

To His Excellency SIR JOHN HENRY LEFROY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Lieutenant-General in Her Majesty's Army, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Twenty-first Report of the proceedings of the Council from 1st May, 1880, to 30th April, 1881. 22 Vict.No.21, Section 30.

2. The Rev. George Clarke was re-elected President for the year ending 30th June, 1881. President.

3. The Annual Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions was held in the month of June, 1880. Five Students presented themselves for examination; and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the annual value of £20 each for four years were awarded to Henry Frank Miles, pupil of Rev. R. D. Poulett-Harris, M.A., High School, Hobart, and William Leslie Giblin, pupil of the Rev. J. V. Buckland, B.A., Hutchins School, Hobart. One other obtained a standard of marks sufficient to entitle him to an Exhibition. Council of Education Exhibitions, Gazette Notice, 6th July, 1880.

The recommendation contained in our last Report regarding the creation of three additional Exhibitions annually, and the throwing open of the whole of the Exhibitions to boys and girls alike, appears to have escaped the consideration of the Executive, as no provision has been made upon the Estimates for the current year for such Exhibitions.

We have therefore again brought the matter under the notice of the Government, in hope that we may be enabled to offer the five Exhibitions for competition in the year 1882.

4. The twenty-first examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in December, 1880; the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D., Melbourne, being Examiner in English, Latin, Greek, French, Pure Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, Geology, Zoology and Botany; the Rev. Thos. Kelch, Examiner in Italian; J. A. Jackson, Esq., B.A., Examiner in German; Henry Hunter, Esq., Examiner in Drawing; and J. Summers, Esq., Examiner in Music. Twenty-one Candidates under nineteen years of age presented themselves; twenty passed the Preliminary Examination, and eighteen succeeded in obtaining the Degree: ten being placed in the First Class, five in the Second Class, and three in the Third Class. Degree of Associate of Arts, Gazette Notice, 28th Dec., 1880.

5. Evett Gordon Allport, as Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal. He also gained First Prizes for Latin, Greek, and Mathematics; Second Prizes for English and Italian, and a Prize for Geology. Prizes were awarded to the under-mentioned Associates, who were placed in the First Class, as follows:—Francis

Sydney Knight, First Prize for French, and Second Prizes for Latin and Mathematics; Frederick Miller Johnson, Prize for Zoology and Botany; Mary Caroline Dickson, First Prizes for English, German, and Italian, and Second Prize for French; Percy Gower Oldmeadow, Prize for Natural Philosophy. Prizes were awarded to the Associates who gained a Second Class as follows:—Emma Constance Gatehouse, Prize for Drawing, and Robert Gillespie Scott, Second Prize for Greek; and Ethel Jane Huxtable, who was placed in the Third Class, obtained a Prize for Music.

The Examiner-in-Chief in his Report observes:—

“The Examiner-in-Chief has now only to observe, in conclusion, that the standard of proficiency has been well maintained by the several Candidates this year. His own observations, fully corroborated by the reports of his co-examiners, have produced the most satisfactory conviction that the Candidates have been well instructed, and have laboured assiduously. Even in the case of those whose marks did not reach the regulation number to entitle them to a class, some papers were most creditably done; but when the number of subjects brought up are few a single failure will often prove fatal.”

6. The Examination for Tasmanian Scholarships in December last was conducted by the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D. Six candidates presented themselves; two, John Singleton Clemons, A.A., 1877, and John Warnock, A.A., 1879, reached the standard prescribed by the Council. A Scholarship was awarded to each of them, and they have since proceeded to Great Britain to enter upon their University studies. Two others, Frederick Lodge, A.A. 1878, and Allen John Baxter, A.A. 1879, came within the limits of eligibility to a Scholarship.

Scholars'
progress.

7. Of the progress of the Tasmanian Scholars, we have much pleasure in stating that Mr. A. P. Canaway, Scholar of 1875, took his B.A. Degree at Oxford Trinity Term, 1880, gaining a Second Class in the Honor List. Mr. W. H. Buckland, Scholar of 1876, also took his B.A. Degree at the same University in Michaelmas Term, 1880, his name appearing in the Third Class Honor List. The latter has returned to the Colony, and his services have been secured for the Hutchins School; the former is expected to arrive in the Colony at the end of the current year. Mr. Alfred Doran, Tasmanian Scholar of 1875, who we noted in our last Report as having taken his B.A. Degree in March, we learn has passed satisfactorily in Roman Law in the Michaelmas Examination, 1880, of Students of the Inns of Court, Inner Temple, and has since been called to the Bar: he is at present engaged as Master at Cheam School. Mr. J. G. Lindsay, Tasmanian Scholar of 1878, entered the Inner Temple on the 1st November last, and has been diligently prosecuting his studies. Mr. G. Q. Roberts, Tasmanian Scholar of the same year, passed his Moderations at Christmas last, and has taken up Law and History for his Finals. Mr. G. A. Webster, Tasmanian Scholar of 1879, has entered Caius College, Cambridge, and has passed his “Little-go” creditably.

It may be of interest to mention that of the fifteen Tasmanian Scholars who have taken their Degree ten have returned at different times to the Colony, and the majority of this number have made it their permanent residence, and three others, we learn, contemplate returning at an early date.

Minor
Scholarships.

8. The two Minor Scholarships at the disposal of the Council for this year were awarded to Evett Gordon Allport and Francis Sydney Knight, who stood first and second respectively on the list of Associates of the year, they having intimated their intention to study and compete for a Tasmanian Scholarship. These Scholarships are each of the value of £40 per annum, and are tenable for two years.

9. The Dry Scholarship was awarded to Evett Gordon Allport, Senior Associate of the year, he having announced his intention of studying for the Tasmanian Scholarship Examination. Dry Scholarship.

10. Since the publication of our last Report two examinations of candidates for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne have been held in Hobart under our supervision, with the following results:—2nd February Term, 1880—Six Candidates. Two failed. Four, viz., Henry James Brownell, Philip M'Kenzie Pitt, Francis Henry Stephenson, and Samuel Percy Crisp, passed the Matriculation Examination, and, with the exception of the latter named, the Civil Service Examination also. October Term, 1880—Seven Candidates. Two failed. Five, viz., Ernest Judd Barnett, Fredk. John Derham, Mary Rose Foy, Stephen Henry Hughes, and Arthur Percival Morriss, passed both the Matriculation and the Civil Service Examination, and James T. Weaver, though failing in the Matriculation Examination, succeeded in passing the Civil Service Examination. Local Examination for Matriculation at Melbourne University.

11. We have framed the following Rules to form part of Sections 18 and 25 respectively of our Regulations, and have duly obtained the approval of Your Excellency in Council thereto:— Rules for computing ages of Candidates for A. A. Degree and Tas. Scholarships, Gazette Notice, 14th Sept., 1880.

DEGREE OF ASSOCIATE OF ARTS.

To form part of Section 18.

The first day of September in each year is fixed and appointed as the date upon which the ages of Candidates for the Degree of Associate of Arts shall in each year be ascertained and computed.

TASMANIAN SCHOLARSHIPS.

To form part of Section 25.

The first day of September in each year is fixed and appointed as the date upon which the ages of Candidates for the Tasmanian Scholarships shall in each year be ascertained and computed.

13. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st January and the 31st December, 1880, the termination of the financial year, together with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1881. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1880 is shown to have amounted to £2036 16s. 0d. Financial Statement.

14. We append to our Report a Roll of the Tasmanian Scholars, a List of those Students who have obtained the Degree of Associate of Arts, and a List of those who obtained Exhibitions offered by the Council. Appendices A, B, and C.
