- 1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.
- 2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.
- 3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. The Speaker read Prayers.
- 4 AUSLAN INTERPRETER ADMITTED. In accordance with the Resolution agreed to by the House on 18 September 2024, Ms Allie Dowl, AUSLAN Interpreter was invited onto the floor of the House to sign a statement made by the Premier, the Leader of the Opposition and the Leader of the Greens made a Statement to the House in relation to International Sign Language Day.

Following which, the Ms Dowl withdrew.

- **5** QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.
- **6** CONSTITUENCY QUESTIONS. In accordance with Sessional Order No. 48C, Constituency Questions were asked.
- 7 PETITION. The Minister for Primary Industries and Water presented a Petition from approximately 368 residents of Swansea, requesting that the House call on the Government to establish a part-time Service Tasmania Service Centre at Swansea. (HA6/2024).

- THE LATE HONOURABLE FRANCIS ROGER GROOM: CONDOLENCE RESOLUTION. *Resolved, nemine contradicente* That this House expresses its deep sadness at the death on 25 August 2024 of the Honourable Francis Roger Groom, a former Minister of the Crown from 1982 to 1996, and a Member for the Division of Braddon from 1976 to 1997, and places on record its appreciation of his service to this State, and further, that this House respectfully tenders to his family its sincere sympathy in their bereavement.
