QUESTION:

If a staff member in the Tasmanian Health Service reported workplace abuse, misconduct or malpractice, would they be protected from reprisal under the *Public Interest Disclosures Act 2002*? If not, why not?

ANSWER:

- 1. Section 19 of the *Public Interest Disclosures Act 2002* (the Act) provides that a person must not take detrimental action against a person in reprisal for a protected disclosure.
- 2. Part 2 of the Act sets out the requirements for a protected disclosure.
