### *REPORT for 1889.*

---

Hobart, 11th March, 1890.

SIR,

THE Ladies' Committee, in presenting their Ninth Annual Report, are glad to say the work of the Institution has gone on quietly throughout the year.

The Institution continues to be self-supporting, and has now a sum of £357 8s. 1d. towards a building or reserve fund.

At the beginning of the year there were thirteen girls, and nine were received during the year, two girls coming in voluntarily; and five left the Institution. Their behaviour, on the whole, has been good.

Every Sunday morning a short service is held in the Institution, and classes by ladies for Bible instruction.

The girls are employed in washing, housework, cooking, and needlework; receive instruction in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

The amount received by washing during the year is £281 18s.

Improvements have been made to the building, which have cost £9 10s.

The Committee again record their appreciation of the energy and zeal of the Matrons, which help so much towards the success of the Institution.
